ABSOLUTE PARDON

MOINIFAR, Hassan

Hassan Moinifar, an Iranian immigrant, came to the United States in 1985 seeking a better life for his family and for himself. In working hard to build a new life, he established himself as a small business owner. In 1989 however, after a series of unfortunate events, Mr. Moinifar was convicted in the Fairfax County Circuit Court of unlawful wounding.

After his sentencing in August of 1989, Mr. Moinifar served approximately 6 months in jail. During this time, he converted from his Islamic faith to Christianity.

Since release from incarceration, Mr. Moinifar, who currently resides in Falls Church, started another business and has again become a productive member of society. Additionally, he has raised two daughters and actively participates in community outreach programs. Mr. Moinifar is a member of the Faith Bible Church, which he has attended regularly since his release.

Solely due to his conviction some nine years ago, Mr. Moinifar had been ordered to report to the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service on December 23, 1998 for deportation to Iran.

Having exhausted his appeals for relief from his deportation order without success, Mr. Moinifar petitioned for an absolute pardon. The granting of an absolute pardon would remove Mr. Moinifar's conviction as the basis for deportation.

Mr. Moinifar professes that his return to Iran would result in his persecution because he has abandoned Islam for Christianity. Under Islamic law, renunciation of Islam, or what is more commonly referred to as apostasy, is punishable by death. The consequences of this imminent deportation are further complicated by the fact that Mr. Moinifar is suffering from a brain tumor. Mr. Moinifar's doctor advises that failure to closely monitor and treat this medical condition could result in Mr. Moinifar's death.

Mr. Moinifar has served his punishment for the offense he committed. He has resumed his place as a productive, law-abiding member of our society. Accordingly, after careful consideration of the extraordinary circumstances of this case, the numerous letters of reference from family, friends, and community leaders, and the supplemental information submitted by Mr. Moinifar's counsel the petition was granted.

On April 18, 1998, Donnie S. Daniels submitted through his mother, Wanda Daniels, a request for Executive Clemency based upon the fact that he had been diagnosed with End Stage Lung Cancer (Stage IV-B). His request was then submitted to the Medical Clemency Assessment Committee which is directed to review all requests for clemency which are based on allegations of fatal illnesses.

It was determined that Donnie S. Daniels' condition had deteriorated to the point where advising physicians could not assure that he would survive beyond the requisite three month period, and the medical clemency request was granted.
