ABSOLUTE PARDON

WASHINGTON, Earl

Crime(s)

Rape and Murder

In May of 1983, in Fauquier County, Earl Washington was arrested for breaking and entering the home of a 73-year-old woman, stealing a gun and money from her, and brutally beating her. As a result of those crimes, Washington pled guilty to statutory burglary and malicious wounding, and he was sentenced to a 30-year prison term (two consecutive 15-year prison terms) for those offenses.

While Washington was in custody for those criminal offenses, he was questioned about the rape and murder of Mrs. Rebecca Williams a year earlier in Culpeper County. Washington confessed to raping and murdering Rebecca Williams in her apartment on June 4, 1982.

Based on Washington's confession and other corroborating evidence, Washington was tried and convicted of the capital murder and rape of Rebecca Williams and sentenced to death.

Ten years later, Governor L. Douglas Wilder reviewed new DNA tests of samples taken from the victim and Washington. The DNA results were inconclusive but did not exonerate Washington. In light of that new information, Governor Wilder commuted Washington's death sentence to life in prison with the possibility of parole.

On June 1, 2000, Governor James S. Gilmore, III directed the Virginia Division of Forensic Science to perform further DNA tests on evidence taken from the apartment of Mrs. Williams and her body. The purpose of these tests was to apply the most technologically-advanced scientific methods to the evidence available. The Virginia Division of Forensic Science proceeded to perform DNA tests on all known and available evidence. Some evidence taken from the crime scene in 1983 had deteriorated and was not susceptible to DNA testing. According to results of the new DNA tests of available evidence, Washington was excluded from semen taken from Mrs. William's body and other DNA evidence in the room was confirmed to belong to yet another person, and not Earl Washington. Earl Washington's DNA could not be located elsewhere in the apartment.

This additional DNA evidence did not prove the identity of the murderer. As such, Earl Washington could not be exonerated or "cleared" of this murder. However, the Governor concluded that a jury afforded the benefit of the DNA evidence and analysis available today would have reached a different verdict regarding the guilt of Earl Washington, based on reasonable doubt. Therefore the Governor granted Earl Washington an absolute pardon.

His request was submitted to the Medical Clemency Assessment Committee, which reviews all requests for clemency based on allegations of fatal illness.

The medical clemency was granted because it was determined that James P. Carroll's condition had deteriorated to the point where advising physicians could not assure that he would survive beyond the requisite three-month period.

His request was then submitted to the Medical Clemency Assessment Committee, which reviews all requests for clemency based on allegations of fatal illness.

The medical clemency was granted because it was determined that Howard L. Ross' condition had deteriorated to the point where advising physicians could not assure that he would survive beyond the requisite three-month period.

Included in the Parole Board's recommendation was the fact that she is involved in the community through membership in the First Baptist Church of Charlottesville and intends to complete her education with a degree in finance. The Governor granted Dina Marie Armstrong a simple pardon. This pardon will not alter or erase the conviction or record of the above described misdemeanor, but will serve as official forgiveness for the offense and provides Ms. Armstrong the ability to move forward in life.
