Item 383, Paragraph I in Chapter 951, of the 2004 Virginia Acts of Assembly, approved May 4, 2005 provides that the amount of the Conservation Resources Fund utilized for the operation of state parks shall be approved by the Secretary of Natural Resources and shall be reported on a quarterly basis to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees.

Attached is our estimated revenue and uses of that revenue for FY 2005 that we shared with you previously, and the 3rd and 4th^d quarter (January 1, 2005 through March 31, 2005 and April 1, 2005 through June 30, 2005) expenditures of the fund for FY 2005. As with past years, revenue has been monitored and the operating plan adjusted to accommodate revenue fluctuations.
