Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the first quarter of the 2006 fiscal year as required by **Chapter 951**, **Item 128.H.**

As of September 30, 2005, a total of \$150,809,616 had been appropriated to the Fund. This amount excludes legislative mandates and monies which were unallotted after the original allocation. As of September 30, 2005, the cash balance was \$35,685,235, and the balance available for future commitments totaled \$21,870,235. Grants awarded since the inception of the fund total 327.

For the first quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, ended September 30, 2005, a total of \$625,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist three projects relocating to or expanding in the state. Total job creation of these projects was 577, while investment totaled \$81.6 million. Summaries on these projects follow:

- 1. <u>Tazewell County</u>: **Clinch River Forest Products** will locate a lumber mill in Tazewell County. Clinch River will create 102 jobs and invest \$4.3 million (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: site improvements). **This project has not been announced**.
- 2. <u>City of Martinsville</u>: **Hooker Furniture**, a manufacturer of furniture, will expand its existing facility in the City of Martinsville. With an investment totaling \$8.5 million, this expansion will save 325 existing jobs for Virginia (amount of grant: \$325,000; use of grant: modernization of existing manufacturing facility). **This project has not been announced**.
- 3. <u>City of Virginia Beach</u>: **Stihl Incorporated**, a manufacturer of outdoor power equipment, will expand its existing facility in the City of Virginia Beach. Investment will total \$68.8 million, with 150 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: infrastructure improvements). **This project has not been announced**.

For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the first quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to Culpeper County for Merillat Industries; the City of Roanoke for Johnstown America; Wythe County for PepsiCo; Roanoke County for Tecton; and Wythe County for Klockner Pentaplast. Actual disbursements totaled \$1,325,000.
