Report on Business Incentives 2004-2005



A Report to the Chairmen of the House Committees on Appropriations and Finance and the Senate Finance Committee

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the 2005 Appropriations Act, the General Assembly directed the Secretary of Commerce and Trade to report to the Chairmen of the Senate Finance Committee and House Committees on Appropriations and Finance "on the use and efficacy of state incentives in creating investments and jobs in Virginia."¹ In apparent recognition of the wide range of programs offered by the Commonwealth and its localities, the General Assembly asked that "for the purposes of this report, the incentives to be reviewed in the study are those incentives included in the Virginia Economic Development Partnership's publication, *Virginia Guide to Business Incentives 1997-98.*" Thus, incentives offered by local governments and various other means of recruitment and expansion are not listed herein.²

Governor Warner has demonstrated his commitment to expanding and sustaining economic development in the Commonwealth. As Secretary of Commerce and Trade, I am pleased to report that Virginia has enjoyed tremendous success in economic development this year.

Despite this success, we must not rest on our accomplishments. Instead, we must ensure that we obtain the maximum return on our investment, both in the use of incentives and with any other economic development measures. Moreover, we must be vigilant to maintain our competitive edge. Our competitors, both in our region and across the nation and the world, are finding new ways to attract and retain business through fiscal and other policies.

This report, as requested, is a compilation of results from the last fiscal year. These results demonstrate an effective record of economic development in terms of investment and job creation. The multiplier effect on the community, including other industries attracted as a result of the new or expanded business, makes these results even more significant. Of course, in analyzing incentives, we must examine the total Virginia effort rather than only looking at each separate program in a vacuum.

In the area of business incentives, during the 2005 General Assembly session we successfully sought passage of an expanded performance program for headquarters operations and financial services businesses as Virginia needs to be more competitive in order to attract these high-growth companies. In many situations our existing incentives were not available to these high-wage large employers, because their projects may not feature significant new capital investment.

There are many examples of Virginia's economic development successes, and they receive a more detailed presentation in the Annual Report of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership. This report is available on the VEDP website at www.yesvirginia.org/corporate_location/library.aspx.

² Recruitment often generates an entire negotiated range of activities, which can include private activity bond allocation, advantageous utility rates, regulatory assistance, proposed legislative changes, assistance in accessing private capital, and assistance with environmental certifications and permitting.

Report on Business Incentives

Part One of this report is organized by the individual incentives listed in the *Virginia Guide to Business Incentives 1997-98.* It should be noted, however, that some of the programs or benefits listed in the *Virginia Guide to Business Incentives* are not direct financial incentives, in the common usage of that term.³ For example, some of the items consist of financing or entrepreneurial assistance. Among these are Industrial Development Bonds or loans and loan guarantees issued by the Virginia Small Business Financing Authority. These are directed to assist industry in obtaining private capital. Others offer management and technical support, such as that provided by the Small Business Development Centers operated under the auspices of the Department of Business Assistance (DBA), the Center for Innovative Technology, or the A. L. Philpott Manufacturing Extension Partnership. Similarly, consulting and video production services offered by DBA through its Workforce Services Division are not traditional financial incentives.

Another group of items listed consists of federal monies provided under specific federal programs, such as the Community Development Block Grants (CDBG), Workforce Investment Act, Dislocated Worker Program, and similar programs. This report does include CDBG funding to localities for economic development projects. In addition, other items listed simply are automatic entitlements, not negotiated, in amounts set by statute. This group primarily involves the tax credits applied by the Department of Taxation, including the Major Business Facility Job Tax Credit and the Recycling Tax Credit, which are used in business recruitment and expansion. In addition, the Coalfield Employment Enhancement Tax Credit seeks to maintain the viability of coal companies and coalfield employment in Virginia.

Of the incentives listed, the Appropriations Act requested the most recent data available (*i.e.*, FY 2005) identified by planning district commission as follows: (1) the number of companies receiving business incentives; (2) the dollar amounts received by each company for each incentive; (3) the number of jobs to be created; (4) the average salary; and (5) the amount of private investment agreed upon by the state and the company as a condition for receiving the incentives.⁴ The General Assembly specified that in Part One of the report the names of companies participating in the state's incentive programs shall not be revealed.

The body of Part One of this report is organized by the individual incentives listed. Appendix 1 provides the data in a composite fashion for FY 2005, showing all incentives received by company. The database was assembled by combining the records provided by various agencies and cross-referencing them by project, company, and fiscal year. Since the Virginia Department of Taxation is statutorily prohibited from revealing taxpayer names and information, certain tax credit programs were not included in the composite database but are included in the Tax Incentives section.

The Appropriations Act requires that Part Two of this report include the following information on the performance of projects receiving incentives in FY 1999: (1) name of the company receiving incentives; (2) the actual number of jobs created; (3) the average salary; and (4) the actual dollar value of private investment made by these companies. Because of the time elapsed since that requirement was included, and after discussion with appropriations, staff, the report instead focuses on the performance of projects receiving incentives in FY 2000.

In addition, the Appropriations Act requested identification of specific state actions taken by the state as part of its business incentive programs to create private investments and jobs in rural areas of the state and the success of these actions. This information is presented in Part Three of this report.

³ This statement is not meant to diminish the effectiveness of these programs. All of these programs are valuable economic development tools. Many of these are used in conjunction with other programs to recruit a new or expanding business. Job creation results are sometimes difficult to measure in connection with these programs.

⁴ Ordinarily, when incentives are offered to a company, they have a certain period of time to meet the investment and job creation performances for which they were provided. For example, a company receiving a Governor's Opportunity Fund grant must fulfill its performance expectations within 30 months of receipt of the grant. Therefore, the actual number of jobs, their average salary, and the level of investment used in this part of the report are the estimates used in calculating the incentive offered.

PART ONE

Tax Incentives

Due to the statutory privacy protections required for all taxpayers, corporate and individual, the Department of Taxation is prohibited from providing any information that directly identifies or indirectly could tend to identify any taxpayer and its income or tax situation. As a result, the information available for this report is summarized. It must also be noted that all data of the Department of Taxation is kept on a calendar year basis rather than by fiscal year. In addition, there is approximately an 18-month delay in the compilation of tax year data due to the filing patterns of corporate taxpayers, so the data presented in this report is from tax year 2003.

Two of these programs, the Major Business Facility Job Tax Credit and the Recycling Tax Credit, are statutory rather than discretionary; that is, the amount of the credit earned is determined objectively by the number of jobs created or the amount of money invested in facilities or recycling equipment, respectively. Nevertheless, these two tax credits are included as incentives because they are cited to economic development prospects as potential benefits of locating or expanding facilities in Virginia. A description of the two tax credit programs is provided below.

Major Business Facility Job Tax Credit

This statute provides a corporate income tax credit of \$1,000 per job over three years to qualified companies locating to or expanding in Virginia and creating either 50 new full-time jobs if in an enterprise zone or 100 new jobs if elsewhere. During tax year 2003, 17 taxpayers in Virginia claimed this tax credit against Virginia corporate income tax, for a total dollar amount of \$6,719,516.

In addition to traditional corporate entities, this credit may also be claimed by "individuals" when an Scorporation, limited partnership, or limited liability corporation is involved. During tax year 2003, six taxpayers received this credit for a total dollar amount of \$231,898.

Recycling Equipment Tax Credit

This statutory program provides a tax credit of 10% of every dollar invested in certified recycling equipment or facilities. The certification is administered by the Department of Environmental Quality. During tax year 2003, 13 Virginia corporate taxpayers claimed credits under this statute, for a total dollar amount of \$327,273.

In addition to traditional corporate entities, this credit may also be claimed by "individuals" when an Scorporation, limited partnership, or limited liability corporation is involved. During tax year 2003, 70 individual taxpayers received this credit for a total dollar amount of \$794,333.

Worker Retraining Tax Credit

The Worker Retraining Tax Credit became effective during tax year 1998. In all but one previous years, the data for this tax was withheld by the Department of Taxation to avoid disclosure of confidential taxpayer information. This typically occurs when the number of taxpayers is so small that any disclosure might reveal protected data. During tax year 2003, 11 individual and corporate taxpayers in Virginia received this tax credit for a total dollar amount of \$17,110. Individual and corporate taxpayer data were combined to protect confidential taxpayer information.

Coalfield Employment Enhancement Tax Credit

The Coalfield Employment Enhancement Tax Credit provides a corporate income tax credit to companies that mine small coal seams. Credits are calculated per ton based on the thickness of the seam. During tax year 2003, 22 individual taxpayers claimed the credit for a total of \$6,302,827. In addition, 10 corporate taxpayers claimed \$21,191,256 in credits from this program. This is a significant increase from the 2002 data.

Enterprise Zone Incentives

Virginia's Enterprise Zone Program offers a number of business incentives to encourage job creation and investment within designated zones across Virginia. The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) administers the Enterprise Zone Program.

During the 2005 legislative session, the new Enterprise Zone Grant Act was passed in anticipation of the sunset of the existing Act. Beginning July 1, 2005, two grant-based incentives will be offered under the new program: job creation grants and real property investment grants. Calendar year 2005 will be the first year that the new grants are available.

Businesses that have qualified for the General Income Tax Credits, Investment Tax Credits, or Job Grants by July 1, 2005, may finish out the remainder of their qualification period for the respective incentive provided that the business meets the qualification requirements.

Businesses that have signed agreements with DHCD by July 1, 2005, for the usage of General Income Tax Credits or Investment Tax Credits can begin their incentive qualification any time after they meet the conditions of their agreement with DHCD and the qualification requirements for the incentive.

The 2004-2005 Report on Business Incentives includes data and incentive activity prior to the sunset of the Enterprise Zone Act. Data for the following incentives is included in this report: General Income Tax Credit, Real Property Improvement Tax Credit, Investment Tax Credit, and Job Grants.

Tax credits for the 2004 tax year were allocated in June 2005. The incentive data provided in this report is current as of July 5, 2005. A total of 358 businesses used the tax credits.

An annual tax credit authorization of \$16 million was applied to the General Income and the Real Property Improvement tax credits for small qualified business firms and small qualified zone residents. An annual tax credit authorization of \$3 million was applied to the General Income and Investment tax credits for large qualified business firms and large qualified zone residents. For tax year 2004, the total amount of tax credit requests from qualified businesses exceeded the total allocated enterprise zone tax credit cap of \$19 million for large and small qualified business firms and large and small qualified zone residents. As a result, DHCD issued each qualified business a pro-rated tax credit.

A total of 148 businesses qualified for the enterprise zone job grants in 2004. Businesses requested a total of \$2,500,760 in job grants for calendar year 2004. There was a job grant appropriation of \$1,960,000 allocated to the Department for distribution. As a result, job grants were prorated.

Demand for enterprise zone incentives in 2004 increased across the board. The number of businesses qualifying for state incentives increased 15 percent from figures reported in the 2003 Tax Year Enterprise Zone Program Annual Report.

It is important to note that companies can qualify for and receive the general income tax credit, job grants, and the real property improvement tax credit for the same year. DHCD does not collect wage information for these programs; therefore, this information is not provided in Appendix B. When a company also received assistance from another incentive program that does collect this information, the wage or salary information is provided in the composite data set contained in Appendix H. Appendix B contains a geographic breakdown by Planning District Commission (PDC) of the use of this incentive.

General Income Tax Credit

The general income tax credit is a ten-year tax credit against a business' state tax liability in an amount up to 80 percent in year one and 60 percent in years two through ten. In qualifying year 2004, 193 small-qualified businesses (i.e., businesses that invested less than \$15 million and created less than 50 new jobs) claimed this credit. Tax credits for such businesses were pro-rated at 77 percent and with this pro-ration, totaled \$4,151,045.

If a company is investing more than \$15 million and creating 50 or more full-time jobs (i.e. a large qualified business) it will receive a negotiated level of the General Income Tax Credit. Three new companies received \$1,292,168 in negotiated General Income Tax Credits in qualifying year 2004. In addition, three existing companies claimed a total of \$1,375,097 in negotiated General Income Tax Credits. Tax credits for such businesses were pro-rated at 94 percent in 2004.

Refundable Real Property Improvement Tax Credit

The real property improvement tax credit is equal to an amount up to 30 percent of qualified improvements to real property, with a maximum of \$125,000 within a five-year period. The credit is available for the tax year in which the property is placed in service. The credit is applied first to the firm's state tax liability. The remaining balance, if any, is then refunded to the business. This credit was claimed by 158 taxpayers during qualifying year 2004. Real Property Improvement Tax Credits for such businesses were pro-rated at 77 percent and with this pro-ration, totaled \$11,848,959.


Investment Tax Credit

Businesses investing in excess of \$100 million and creating at least 200 jobs were eligible to apply for the Investment Tax Credit in lieu of the Real Property Improvement Tax Credit. The percentage amount of the credit could be worth up to five percent of the investment and must be negotiated. One business qualified for the Investment Tax Credit in 2004.

Enterprise Zone Job Grants

Businesses that created new full-time jobs could receive grants of up to \$500 per job (or \$1,000 if a zone resident fills the position), up to a maximum of \$100,000 per year for three consecutive years. The job grants claimed by taxpayers and paid during fiscal year 2005 represent actual dollars paid rather than a tax credit. In FY 2005, 148 businesses received job grants totaling \$1,960,000. As noted above, the demand of over \$2.5 million exceeded appropriated funds; so eligible recipients received 78 percent of their job grant requests.



Workforce Services

Workforce Services, managed by the Department of Business Assistance pursuant to §2.2-902.A.1 of the *Code of Virginia*, provides partial reimbursement for training and retraining of individuals for specific newly-created employment opportunities at Virginia businesses. The program also offers services such as "Train the Trainer", recruiting assistance, electronic media support, and funding. In order for companies to qualify for this incentive, they must create a minimum of 25 new jobs and make a capital investment of at least \$1 million. Recipient companies also must pay wages of at least \$8.00 per hour, and generate more than 50% of their revenue from outside the Commonwealth. This incentive is available for location or expansion projects in competition with at least one other state or country. This is one of the most frequently employed business incentives in Virginia for new and expanding operations.

In FY 2005, Workforce Services worked with 231 companies and assisted in training for 13,297 jobs. The reimbursed value for this training amounted to \$7,167,127, and the average training reimbursement per job of \$539 compares favorably with other states' programs and other economic development incentives.

Workforce Services programs were implemented in every region of the state. It is important to note that the project data covers active projects over multiple years. The total award allocated to each company is a multiple year figure that is shown as the "approved budget" column on the following pages. In those cases where a company has been allocated a workforce incentive but has not requested reimbursement during FY 2005, a zero is indicated in the "FY 2005 Spent" column. Since the program provides reimbursement, evidence of the company's actual expenditures must first be provided to substantiate the amount claimed.

Infrastructure Incentives

The Department of Transportation provides grants to localities for infrastructure associated with economic development projects. The two programs provide matching funds to localities for road and rail access to project sites.

Industrial Access Road Program

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) administers the Industrial Access Road Program through its Local Assistance Division. This program provides matching grants to Virginia localities to build or complete road access to industrial sites. It is important to note that this program frequently provides funds to localities for access to sites where no industry has yet located. These projects require the posting of a bond to ensure that an industry ultimately will locate at the site. Of the 10 projects funded during FY 2005, seven of these projects were funded as bonded projects. All totaled, the 10 projects received \$3,473,600 from these FY 2005 awards.

Rail Industrial Access Program


The Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation administers the Rail Industrial Access Program, which operates in a similar fashion to the Road program outlined above, in the sense that matching grants are made to localities. In the Rail Access program, however, specific industries must be identified as requiring rail access to the site to be eligible. During FY 2005, 13 awards were made for rail access totaling \$4,917,200.

Community Development Block Grants

The Department of Housing and Community Development administers the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program within Virginia. This program assists localities in preparing for economic development.

The CDBG Program is a federally-funded program administered by the Commonwealth of Virginia for the non-urban areas of the state. Grants are provided to local governments for a wide range of community needs including housing, facilities, services, and economic development. For economic development purposes, these funds are typically used for off-site improvements related to water and sewer utilities. Projects funded with CDBG resources must meet one of the following Congressionally-mandated national objectives: (1) provide primary benefit to low- and moderate-income citizens; (2) prevent or eliminate slums or blight; and (3) address an urgent community development need. Funds are provided on a competitive basis and demand has historically exceeded the resources available.

In FY 2005, CDBG funding was obligated for three projects that created 216 jobs. The three grant awards totaled \$1,190,284.





Financial Assistance Incentives

Several programs provide direct grants to localities or companies to encourage the creation of jobs and new investment in Virginia.

Governor's Opportunity Fund (GOF)

The GOF, administered by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, serves as a "deal closing fund" used at the Governor's discretion when necessary to secure a location or expansion for Virginia in the face of competition from other states or countries. A local government or industrial development authority may apply for matching funds to assist a prospect with site acquisition and development, construction or build-out, transportation access, or other allowable capital expenditures, as well as workforce training. Projects benefiting from a GOF grant must meet minimum levels of investment and job creation based on the population of the locality applying for the grant (see *Code of Virginia* § 2.2-115 et seq.).

In FY 2005, the GOF provided \$11,012,500 in the form of 30 grants. These grants resulted in companies announcing new investments of \$907,708,500 and the creation of 7,595 new jobs. The average projected salary for these announced new jobs is \$34784.

This equates to \$1,450 of state GOF investment per new job and \$82 of private investment for each dollar of state GOF grant. The dollar-per-job performance measure for job creation using the GOF compares very favorably with the national range of \$2,000 to \$5,000 of state investment per new job created. The efficacy of this incentive has remained high even in the face of increased competition for economic development locations nationally. This reflects Virginia's attractive business climate and aggressive recruitment and expansion efforts.

Eleven of the 21 PDCs received GOF grants, with Mount Rogers, West Piedmont, and Southside receiving the highest number of grants (six, four, and four respectively). Two-thirds of the GOF grants awarded in FY 2005 went to economically distressed areas.

The Virginia Investment Partnership (VIP)

The Virginia Investment Partnership, administered by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, is an investment performance grant program for existing Virginia manufacturers and large basic employers.

The program targets companies that have operated in Virginia for at least five years and propose competitive projects that fall into one of the following two tiers: (1) Tier One - existing Virginia manufacturers investing at least \$25 million to increase the productivity of a Virginia manufacturing facility or to utilize a more advanced technology; (2) Tier Two - existing Virginia basic employers investing at least \$100 million and creating at least 1,000 new jobs, or corporate headquarters and other basic employers that make a capital investment of at least \$100 million and create at least 400 jobs paying at least twice the prevailing average wage for the area.

Discretionary VIP performance grants are negotiated amounts based on the new revenue for the Commonwealth, as determined by the Governor based on the recommendations of the Secretary of Commerce and Trade and the Virginia Economic Development Partnership. Although no job creation is required for the first tier, the eligible manufacturer's employment base in Virginia must at least remain stable. A performance agreement between the company and the Commonwealth ensures the fulfillment of the promised capital investment and job creation. These performance grants are paid in five annual installments beginning in the sixth year after the capital investment and job creation (if applicable) is completed, or in the fourth year after the capital investment is completed and verified for companies located in fiscally distressed areas.

During FY 2005, seven Tier One VIP grants were awarded totaling \$5,900,000. The projects associated with these four grants will result in the creation of \$590 million in new capital investment and 462 jobs. One Tier Two VIP grant was awarded in FY 2005 for \$8 million. The Tier Two project will result in the creation of 4,600 jobs and \$133 million in new capital investment.

Solar Photovoltaic Manufacturing Incentive Grants (SMIG)

The Solar Photovoltaic Manufacturing Grant program, administered by the Department of Mines, Minerals, and Energy, is designed to encourage the full value-added product development and manufacture of solar photovoltaic panels and to promote the development of a high technology, renewable energy industry in Virginia.

Under this program, any manufacturer who sells photovoltaic panels manufactured in Virginia is eligible for an annual incentive grant of up to seventy-five cents per watt of the rated capacity of panels sold. The cap on grants available in any given calendar year is \$4.5 million (subject to appropriations). In the event that the applications exceed the annual limit, grant payments will be apportioned among the eligible applicants.

Solar photovoltaic panel manufacturers are eligible to receive annual incentive grants for six years. The amount of the grant would be awarded as follows:

- Years 1 and 2 \$0.75/watt
- Years 3 and 4 \$0.50/watt
- Years 5 and 6 \$0.25/watt

The Commonwealth awarded \$1.9 million to BP Solar in FY 2004 as partial payment for manufacturing and sales in calendar years 2000 and 2001. The 2005 Appropriations Act commits the remaining \$1,877,758 due to BP Solar for its 2001 production and sales. No other companies are currently eligible for SMIG awards.

Virginia Coalfield Economic Development Authority (VCEDA)


VCEDA operates several loan and grant programs for its member localities of Buchanan, Dickenson, Lee, Russell, Scott, Tazewell, and Wise counties and the City of Norton. These programs seek to enhance the economic base of the area, attract new diversified industry, and assist existing business to expand.

VCEDA provided \$6,697,250 in seven loans and five grants to businesses during FY 2004. The loans totaled \$6,230,000, and grants totaled \$467,250, for projects projecting \$33.7 million in investments and nearly 1,000 new jobs.

Tobacco Region Opportunity Fund (TROF)

The TROF, under the Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission (TICRC), grants or lends funds to localities in Virginia's tobacco-producing regions (as defined by TICRC) to assist in the creation of new jobs and investment. These grants are used to attract locations or expansions that require incentives greater than those available to any individual locality.

In FY 2005, the TROF provided \$9,782,719 in the form of 39 grants. These grants resulted in companies announcing new investments of over \$515.7 million and creation of 5,878 new jobs.





PART TWO

FY 2000 Project Performance

The FY 2005 Appropriations Act requires that Part Two of this report include the following information on the performance of projects receiving incentives in Fiscal Year 1999: (1) the name of the company receiving incentives; (2) the actual number of jobs created; (3) the average salary; and (4) the actual dollar value of private investment made by these companies. However, because GOF projects typically have a 30-month completion cycle, this portion of the report would be essentially the same as the incentives report for FY 2004. After discussion with House and Senate Appropriations staff, it was agreed that further appropriations acts may wish to consider increasing the fiscal year to be reported each year. This report uses data from GOF projects approved in FY 2000.

A complete data set is available for those projects receiving Governor's Opportunity Fund (GOF) grants in FY 2000, and those projects are presented in Appendix I. The information requested is not kept by the other incentive programs. The VIP was enacted in 1999 and no payments to companies have been made to date, as payment only begin in the sixth year after project completion. VIP project data will be included in the FY 2006 incentives report.

In FY 2000, 24 projects were approved for GOF grants totaling \$9,700,000. These 24 projects were expected to create 5,836 jobs and result in private investment of \$700,138,000. The actual jobs created to date from these projects are 4,245 or 72.7% of the announced total. The actual private investment totaled \$570,878,870, or 81.5% of the announced total. The lower than expected achievement in meeting the total job target may be explained by the state of the economy during the 30-month performance period of these grants. Employment growth in Virginia peaked in July 2000 and declined steadily until March 2001 when the recession officially began. Given construction and ramp up periods, these companies were trying to meet their hiring targets as employment growth was shrinking and the recession began.

Of the 24 projects, 16 (or 66.6%) have fulfilled their performance agreement obligations to date, three projects are still active, and two projects did not achieve their new jobs threshold (Nextel and Intel). In both cases, the companies have made partial repayment as negotiated. Two projects (Engineered Building and Echostar) did not meet their hiring or investment goals and the VEDP is currently working with the locality to recover a portion of the funds. In three cases, the VEDP is working with the locality to determine whether the projects met their goals. In three additional cases, projects did not appear to meet their goals and VEDP is working with localities and negotiations are underway to recoup funds.

PART THREE

Rural Activities and Incentive Programs

The Appropriations Act requires that this report include identification of specific state actions as part of Virginia's business incentive programs to attract private investment and jobs to rural areas of the state and the success of these actions. For the purposes of this report, "urban" is defined as all "urban crescent" PDCs, i.e., PDCs 8, 15, 16, and 23. "Rural" constitutes all other PDCs. Geographic and tabular depictions of the FY 2005 activities of the programs listed below are included in this report.

Governor's Opportunity Fund (GOF)

The GOF, administered by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, has provided more grants to rural Virginia than to other parts of the state. Since the inception of this deal-closing fund, the GOF has provided 59% of all GOF grants to rural Virginia. In FY 2005, 66% of the GOF funds awarded and 55% of the new jobs announced were in rural Virginia. Seventeen percent of the new investment resulting from the use of the GOF incentive was in rural localities.

In an effort to assist rural localities in southwestern and southside Virginia, VEDP revised the GOF guidelines related to the local match requirement. Grants from the Tobacco Region Opportunity Fund (TROF) may now be used as one-half of the local match. The locality applying for the grant provides the other half of the match in cash or in-kind. For localities with at least twice the statewide average unemployment rate, the local match can be reduced or delayed at the Governor's discretion.

The Virginia Investment Partnership (VIP)

Fiftty-five percent of the grants provided by the Virginia Investment Partnership in FY 2005 were made to expansions in rural Virginia companies. The VIP program was changed to allow companies to receive their payout in year four instead of year six if they are located in a fiscally distressed area. Programs such as the VIP help encourage existing employers to expand in those rural areas.

Tobacco Region Opportunity Fund (TROF)


The Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission (TICRC) grants or lends funds to localities in Virginia's tobacco-producing regions (as defined by TICRC) to assist in the creation of new jobs and investment. These grants are used to attract locations or expansions that require incentives greater than those available to any individual locality. TICRC awarded 100% of the grants to rural localities in FY 2005.

Rail Industrial Access Program

The Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation awarded 80% of rail access grants to rural localities in FY 2005. Many rural localities have limited development sites with existing rail access, and this program has been successful in addressing this infrastructure issue for companies considering location in rural Virginia.

Industrial Access Road Program

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) administers this program and in FY 2005, 90% of road access grants went to rural localities. Many rural localities also have limited development sites with existing road access, and this program has been successful in addressing this infrastructure issue for companies considering location in rural Virginia.
