January 12

Pemco Corporation in Bluefield, Virginia, an existing manufacturer, receives a \$400,000 VCEDA loan. Funds are to be used to purchase machinery and tools, allowing Pemco to retain 15 jobs and add 25 new jobs.

February 19

VFP, Inc. is approved for a \$500,000 VCEDA loan to assist the company's location to Scott County. VFP, manufacturer of communications and power equipment shelters, will relocate its manufacturing headquarters to the Duffield Regional Industrial Park. The company employs 68 at its current Duffield manufacturing facility, established in 1997, and plans to add an additional 72 jobs in the next three years. The loan will be used for machinery and tools.

March 10

Governor Mark R. Warner announces that America Online, Inc. (AOL), will open a sales and customer service center in the Hotel Norton. Virtus Marketing is awarded the contract to manage the center, which will create 67 new jobs in the City of Norton through a \$500,000 investment.

April 9

Appalachian Traditions, Inc., receives a \$50,000 VCEDA grant for site development and construction of a multi-purpose building at the Appalachian Traditions Village in Wise County. This non-profit organization promotes Appalachian traditions and cultures, including music, historical sites, foods and storytelling.

April 15

Governor Mark R. Warner announces that Blue Ridge Wood Products, Inc., will open a manufacturing operation in Tazewell County, creating 160 jobs within 30 months. The company will locate its \$3.6 million operation in the former Woodtech facility in the Town of Bluefield, Virginia. VCEDA joined Tazewell County to close the deal for the county's third largest economic development announcement, in terms of jobs, in more than 20 years.

April 22

VCEDA approves a \$700,000 loan to the Wise County Industrial Development Authority for site development and improvements at the Lonesome Pine Regional Business and Technology Park.

We are pleased to submit to you and the General Assembly the 2004 Annual Report of the Virginia Coalfield Economic Development Authority. Highlighting the year was your personal commitment to and participation in announcements and events illustrated in this report.

VCEDA approved three loans and eight grants totaling more than \$2.2 million. New announcements in the region, including AOL/Virtus Marketing in Norton, Blue Ridge Wood Products in Bluefield, Southwest Logistics in Wise and Midpaco in Duffield, will create nearly 500 new jobs with a \$7.3 million investment. Also, 10 expansions in the region this year will create more than 500 jobs and invest \$9.8 million into our local economy.

The Carter Family Memorial Music Center receives a \$113,583 VCEDA grant to be used for building construction, additions and renovations, including new seating, lighting and sound for the Carter Fold facility in Hiltons in Scott County. The grant was awarded from VCEDA's Tourism Capital Improvement Matching Fund.

April 27

VCEDA closes a loan for \$500,000 to VFP, Inc. to purchase machinery and tools. Earlier VFP announced the relocation of its lightweight shelter manufacturing division to Duffield with plans to add 72 jobs in the next three years.

May 14

The Scott County Economic Development Authority receives an \$830,000 VCEDA loan for site development of the Duffield e-Corridor Regional Park Southwest. The loan is the first awarded from the Regional Industrial Park Matching Fund.

May 19

Governor Mark R. Warner joins Dr. Ralph Stanley at the Stanley Museum in Clintwood for a signing ceremony, officially creating Virginia's Heritage Music Trail.

- June 2

Alcoa Wheel Products in Lebanon is awarded a \$494,000 VCEDA loan to purchase machinery and tools. The company announced its decision to stay in Lebanon in October 2002.

- June 29

VCEDA's Executive Advisory Board holds its annual meeting in Lebanon. The focus of the meeting is the future of economic development in the region. Eva Teig Hardy, Senior Vice President of External Affairs and Corporate Communications, Dominion Virginia Power Company, was elected chairperson for 2005.

- July 2

The Lee County Industrial Development Authority receives a \$250,000 VCEDA loan for building renovation, rehabilitation and improvements to VAMCO #1 facility in Pennington Gap.

- July 9

Southwest Logistics,LLC announces its location to Wise County Industrial Park and its plans to create 120 jobs in the next four years.

Executive Director's Report



VCEDA was honored to have Governor Warner serve as captain of our economic development team for major industry-recruiting initiatives in Virginia's Energy Region this year. The governor hosted a VIP Tour, sponsored by VCEDA, and a Bristol Motor Speedway marketing event, sponsored by the Southwest Virginia Economic Development Alliance. There's no substitute for the governor's hands-on involvement, and we appreciate his support.

This was perhaps a historic year for VCEDA. We closed 17 loans and grants to assist projects with \$4.8 million in funding, resulting in 500 jobs, 428 new and 193 retained jobs. This is another example of the VCEDA Board of Directors' smart investment of scarce resources to create and retain jobs.

We appreciate the cooperation and support of the Tobacco Commission on many of our efforts. The Tobacco Commission funded our target marketing research study, as well as the BMS recruiting event, and has participated with VCEDA to fund other projects, from infrastructure to new industry location.

We are troubled by recent events causing two of our major existing industries to close or announce closures, with both moving jobs out of our area and the United States. VCEDA is continuing its efforts to attract new businesses, but we can't ignore these events, and we are more committed than ever to assisting existing industries. We're also broadening our definition of economic development in supporting private sector projects, including tourism.

The Virginia Economic Development Partnership provided tremendous support for the VIP Tour and BMS events and assisted with special initiatives to attract tenants to the Dickenson County shell building and the Travelocity facility. We appreciate their support to improve the economy of the coalfield region.

I also want to thank Sandy Ratliff for all her good work for our region during her 15-year tenure with VCEDA. The entire VCEDA staff is to be commended for their outstanding contributions. We appreciate the continued leadership of our Board of



Directors. Finally, we are saddened by the loss of one of our former chairmen and long time supporter of economic development, Willard Owens. We will miss Willard, as will many other organizations and associates.

Executive Advisory Board

The Executive Advisory Board of the Virginia Coalfield Economic Development Authority discussed energy's impact on the future of economic development in Southwest Virginia during its annual meeting in Lebanon. Established in 1990, the board includes business leaders who provide advice and serve as contacts and liaisons in marketing the region.

Potential for new power plants, the critical role of transportation to economic development, the impact of outsourcing jobs offshore, and coal and natural gas production in the region were some of the topics discussed. Eva Teig Hardy, Senior Vice President, External Affairs and Corporate Communications, Dominion Virginia Power Company, told the group that building a 500-megawatt power plant in Southwest Virginia would provide 1,000 construction jobs over the two-year construction period, 90 plant operator jobs, and 250 mining jobs as well.

August 23

VCEDA awards a \$100,000 grant to the Historic Crab Orchard Museum and Pioneer Park in Tazewell County. The grant will be used for building construction and expansion of the museum's main gallery building.

August 27<u>-28</u>

VCEDA joins Virginia's aCorridor in the Southwest Virginia Economic Development Alliance and plays host to 29 guests from 14 companies at the Bristol Motor Speedway's August race. Regional existing business leaders tell the group about the area's business-friendly advantages.

August 30

The Tazewell County Industrial Development Authority receives a \$500,000 VCEDA loan for machinery and tools for Blue Ridge Wood Products, manufacturer of laminated plywood. Blue Ridge will open a new operation in Bluefield, Virginia.

October 7-8

Governor Mark R. Warner brings several companies to visit the VCEDA region during a VIP Tour hosted by Virginia's chief executive.

October 27

The Buchanan County Industrial Development Authority receives a \$15,000 VCEDA grant to serve as fiscal agent for a tri-county effort to review Buchanan, Dickenson and Wise counties for possible industrial park locations along the Coalfields Expressway.

November 1

The Wise County Industrial Development Authority receives VCEDA loans and a grant totaling \$1.17 million. A \$75,000 grant will be used for last-mile broadband development to the Wise County Industrial Park at Esserville, and a \$195,000 loan will be for improvements at the Wise County shell building.

November 18

Lonesome Pine Arts & Crafts, Inc. receives a \$105,000 VCEDA grant for upgrades and improvements to the Irail of the Lonesome Pine Outdoor Drama facilities in Big Stone Gap.

December 3

The Lee County Industrial Development Authority receives a \$15,000 VCEDA grant to develop a virtual building at the Constitutional Oaks Industrial Park.

New Promotional Theme

VCEDA's Board of Directors made the decision to drop the Virginia Southwest Promise nametag and to promote the area as Virginia's Energy Region. New marketing materials, including an updated image brochure, were created.

Two special events complemented the Authority's business development efforts. The Southwest Virginia Economic Development Alliance (VCEDA and Virginia's aCorridor) hosted 14 companies during a relationship-building event at Bristol Motor Speedway's August race weekend. The Tobacco Commission provided funds for this event and for a research study performed by Chmura Economics&Analytics to target industries for location to Southwest Virginia. Governor Mark Warner served as host to 11 companies in an October VIP Tour of the region. VEDP worked closely with VCEDA to coordinate these two events.

VCEDA and some local economic developers attended several trade shows and exhibited at Fabtech International in Cleveland. VCEDA also participated in a call trip with VEDP in Seattle in March and conducted its own Tennessee/Kentucky marketing mission in July.

In conjunction with VEDP staff, VCEDA helped develop a targeted marketing campaign for the shell building and the Travelocity facility in the Dickenson County Technology Park.

Existing industry visitation, continued support of the VCEDA Ambassadors and the customer contact center managers' quarterly meetings are ongoing programs.


The VCEDA Board of Directors saw some changes in membership this year, and the group continued its support for business attraction, existing industry expansion and infrastructure development initiatives.

The board recognized former chairmen and board members Richard Settle and Terry Estep for their many years of service. New governor's appointees include George F. Cridlin and Richard W. Edwards. Chairman Donald Baker, Robert Raines and Jay Rife were reappointed by the governor. Ed Davidson was chosen by CNX Gas Company to become its newest representative on the VCEDA board.

New representatives from the county Boards of Supervisors include Joseph Keene, Buchanan County; Gene Counts, Dickenson County; and John Peace II, Wise County. The board approved funding for a number of tourism projects, including the Ralph Stanley Museum, the Carter Fold, Appalachian Traditions, "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine" Outdoor Drama, the Historic Crab Orchard Museum and a tourist train project.

The board approved funding for site development at the Lonesome Pine Regional Business & Technology Park, for a regional industrial park study in the Tazewell County area, for an expansion of VFP, Inc. in Scott County, and for site infrastructure development of 65 new acres adjacent to Duffield Regional Industrial Park. Another focus was existing industry expansion.

The board also directed the consolidation of the VCEDA brand, choosing to adopt Virginia's Energy Region as a theme.
