### Proposed Changes to Virginia Public Procurement Act CHAPTER 945 of the Acts of Assembly 2005 (Senate Bill 1327)

Enacting Clause- 5. That the Secretary of Administration shall work with public institutions of higher education and other interested persons to review proposed changes to the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.) of the Code of Virginia and procurement regulations in order to enhance and improve the procurement process for all public bodies in the Commonwealth. The Secretary shall provide a copy of any recommended changes to the Virginia Public Procurement Act to the Governor and to the General Assembly no later than October 1, 2005.
