Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the fourth quarter of the 2006 fiscal year as required by **Chapter 951, Item 128.H.**

As of June 30, 2006, a total of \$151,899,350 had been appropriated to the Fund. This amount excludes legislative mandates and monies which were unallotted after the original allocation. As of June 30, 2006, the cash balance was \$25,036,427, and the balance available for future commitments totaled \$11,846,427. However, when the GOF preapprovals made by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade are taken into account, the available balance is reduced to \$5,541,427. Grants awarded since the inception of the fund total 358.

For the fourth quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, ended June 30, 2006, a total of \$3,167,500 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist 11 projects relocating to or expanding in the state. Total job creation of these projects was 1,159, while investment totaled \$248 million. Summaries on these projects follow:

- 1. Roanoke County/City of Lynchburg: **RR Donnelley**, a manufacturer of print and related services, will expand its existing facilities in Roanoke County, the City of Lynchburg, and Rockingham County. RR Donnelley will create 139 new jobs and invest \$85.2 million (amount of grant: \$1,000,000 [\$500,000 each for Roanoke County and the City of Lynchburg]; use of grant: site development and training not covered by Workforce Services training grant). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>Franklin County</u>: **McAirlaid's**, a manufacturer of non-woven material, will expand its existing facility in Franklin County. With an investment totaling \$55.3 million, this location will create 120 new jobs (amount of grant: \$500,000; use of grant: site improvement and building development). This project has been announced.
- 3. Town of Lebanon (Russell County): Clinch Mountain Finishing and Logistics, a manufacturer of wood flooring accessories, will expand its existing facility in the Town of Lebanon. Investment will total \$6 million, with 220 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$300,000; use of grant: site development and building construction). This project has been announced.
- 4. <u>City of Bristol</u>: **Prime Choice Foods** will expand its facility in the City of Bristol. Prime Choice is a manufacturer of organic corn tortilla chips and other corn products and will create 35 new jobs. Investment will total \$2.6 million (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 5. <u>City of Danville</u>: **Arista Tubes**, a manufacturer of extruded seamless plastic tubes, will locate a new facility in the City of Danville. Arista will create 145 jobs and invest \$24 million (amount of grant: \$300,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 6. <u>Franklin County</u>: **MW Manufacturers Inc.**, a manufacturer of window and door products, will expand its existing facility in Franklin County. Total investment is \$23 million, with 175 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: site improvements and building development). This project has been announced.
- 7. <u>City of Manassas</u>: **Tosoh SET** will expand its existing facility in the City of Manassas. Tosoh is a chemical cleaner and refurbisher of process kits used in the production of microchips. This expansion will create 27 new jobs, and investment will total \$4 million (amount of grant: \$67,500; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.

- 8. <u>Halifax County</u>: **ABB Inc**. will expand its existing facility in Halifax County. ABB is a manufacturer of power transformers. This company will create 127 new jobs, and investment will total \$27.3 million (amount of grant: \$400,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
- 9. <u>Bland County</u>: **ABB Inc.**, a manufacturer of power transformers, will also expand its existing facility in Bland County. ABB will create 30 new jobs, and investment will total \$3 million (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 10. <u>Louisa County</u>: **Premier Woodworking, Inc.**, a manufacturer of wood and metal retail store fixtures, will expand its facility in Louisa County. With an investment of \$4.82 million, Premier will create 70 jobs and save 30 existing jobs (amount of grant: \$200,000; use of grant: site preparation). **This project has not been announced**.
- 11. <u>Montgomery County</u>: **Federal-Mogul**, a manufacturer of anti-friction engine and replacement bearings, will expand its Montgomery County facility. Federal-Mogul will create 71 new jobs and invest \$12.7 million (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: building improvements). **This project has not been announced**.

For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the fourth quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to Halifax County for Lindstrand Technologies; the City of Chesapeake for American Funds; Mecklenburg County for American Industrial Heat Transfer; the City of Danville for Unarco; Rockingham County for Wal-Mart; Wythe County for Amcor Pet Packaging; and Surry County for Windsor Mill. Actual disbursements totaled \$2,850,000.
