REPORT OF THE VIRGINIA WAR MEMORIAL FOUNDATION

I. Mission

The Virginia War Memorial is a state monument that preserves the memory of Virginians who made the supreme sacrifice in wars and conflicts starting with World War II in order that liberty might live.

The Virginia War Memorial Foundation preserves the memory of those Virginians by using private and public funds to present to the public both permanent and temporary exhibitions, living history presentations, military artifacts, lectures, and a variety of educational outreach programs.

The Foundation will strive to continue to improve the Memorial facilities and programs to keep alive forever the memory of those who sacrificed their lives so that Virginians and all the citizens of the United States shall remain free.

II. Educational Programs

- A. The centerpiece of the Memorial's educational programs is *Virginians at War*. This program uses the interviews of Virginia veterans who participated in the same history-changing event along with archival film, period photographs, animated maps, graphics and music to create 15 to 20 minute long films that are distributed to all Virginia middle and high schools at no cost to the schools. These films are designed to teach history narrated by those lived it. Volume I including six film segments was distributed to schools in 2004. The six films that comprise Volume II were completed during 2006 and the Foundation is seeking a sponsor to distribute it to schools. Currently, these award-winning films are being shown state-wide on PBS.
- B. The Memorial conducts monthly patriotic events that are open to the public and are free and family friendly. Please see attachment #1 for event schedule.
- C. For the first time, the Memorial conducted three student history seminars during the last school year. Due to the response from students and teachers, six seminars are planned for this school year. Please see attachment #2 for seminar schedule.

III. Education Center

During this reporting period, the architectural firm, Glave & Holmes, was selected to design the Memorial's education center. Design schematics have been completed, cost estimates have been updated, and the initial funding has been received from the Commonwealth. Additional funding has been requested and the Memorial's Educational Foundation has started its capital campaign. This education center will provide space for the Memorial's education programs, artifact displays, research library, and move the staff

from crowded temporary trailers currently located at the Memorial. This new center will provide additional teaching opportunities as well as making the Memorial's programs available to the rapidly increasing number of visitors and tour groups.

IV. State-wide Public Relations

In its role as the War Memorial for the entire Commonwealth, the Foundation conducts the following activities to include all Virginia citizens:

- Publication of *Foundation Facts* newsletter which currently has a state-wide mailing list of approximately 5,000.
- The Memorial provides speakers state-wide for veterans' organizations, civic clubs, holiday events, teacher training days, and school programs to acquaint citizens about the Memorial's programs and events.
- State-wide distribution of Virginians at War films as noted above in II.
- State-wide airing of Virginians at War on PBS as noted above in II.

V. Other Services/Programs Planned for the Future

The Foundation is currently seeking a contractor to produce a near-virtual reality film entitled *Into Battle*. This film will use surround sound, strobe lights, and other media to make viewers feel as if they are in the middle of an active battlefield. The horror of war and the sacrifices necessary to protect our nation's freedoms will be depicted.
