Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the second quarter of the 2006 fiscal year as required by **Chapter 951, Item 128.H.** 

As of December 31, 2005, a total of \$151,374,019 had been appropriated to the Fund. This amount excludes legislative mandates and monies which were unallotted after the original allocation. As of December 31, 2005, the cash balance was \$35,685,235, and the balance available for future commitments totaled \$12,781,721. Grants awarded since the inception of the fund total 339.

For the second quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, ended December 31, 2005, a total of \$5,600,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist 12 projects relocating to or expanding in the state. Total job creation of these projects was 2,670, while investment totaled \$499.2 million. Summaries on these projects follow:

- 1. <u>City of Roanoke</u>: **United Health Group**, a designer and administrator of healthcare benefits and services, will expand its facility in the City of Roanoke. United Health Group will create 250 new jobs and invest \$5 million (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>City of Lynchburg</u>: **Framatome ANP, Inc.**, a manufacturer of nuclear plants and nuclear reactors, will expand its existing facility in the City of Lynchburg. With an investment totaling \$5 million, this expansion will create 130 new jobs (amount of grant: \$125,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
- 3. <u>City of Petersburg</u>: **StarTek** will locate a new call center in the City of Petersburg. Investment will total \$4.6 million, with 500 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$225,000; use of grant: grant to the Petersburg Industrial Development Authority to assist with upfit of the building and reduction of the lease rate). This project has been announced.
- 4. <u>Russell County</u>: **CGI-AMS** will locate a new facility in Russell County. CGI-AMS is a provider of information technology and managed services and will create 300 jobs. Investment will total \$6 million (amount of grant: \$700,000; use of grant: building construction and workforce development). This project has been announced.
- 5. <u>City of Staunton</u>: **Specialty Blades**, a manufacturer of industrial and medical cutting blades, will expand its existing facility in the City of Staunton. Specialty Blades will create 25 new jobs and invest \$6 million (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: grant to the Staunton Industrial Development Authority to assist with Specialty Blades' expansion). This project has been announced.
- 6. <u>City of Manassas</u>: **Micron Technology, Inc**. will expand its existing facility in the City of Manassas. Micron is a manufacturer of semiconductor memory products. Total investment is \$400 million, with 320 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$2,000,000; use of grant: educational programs). This project has been announced.
- 7. <u>Washington County</u>: **Universal Fiber Systems, LLC**, a manufacturer of fibers and yarns, will expand its existing facility in Washington County. This location will create 82 new jobs, and investment will total \$8 million (amount of grant: \$200,000; use of grant: infrastructure improvements). This project has been announced.

- 8. <u>City of Galax</u>: **Turman Hardwood Flooring, Inc**. will expand its facility in the City of Galax. Turman is a manufacturer of hardwood flooring. This company will create 40 new jobs, and investment will total \$2.7 million (amount of grant: \$50,000; use of grant: site preparation and building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 9. <u>City of Newport News</u>: **Wolseley**, a distributor of building materials, heating, air conditioning, and plumbing products, will locate a new facility in the City of Newport News. Wolseley will create 420 jobs, and investment will total \$30 million (amount of grant: \$1,050,000; use of grant: grant to the Newport News Industrial Development Authority to assist with the Wolseley's location). This project has been announced.
- 10. <u>City of Chesapeake</u>: **American Funds Service Company**, a manager of mutual funds, will locate a new facility in the City of Chesapeake. American Funds will create 250 jobs and invest \$13.7 million (amount of grant: \$200,000; use of grant: site improvements and building construction). This project has been announced.
- 11. <u>James City County</u>: **Avid Medical, Inc.** a manufacturer of custom procedure trays for the medical industry, will expand its James City County facility. Avid will create 303 new jobs and invest \$7.9 million (amount of grant: \$700,000; use of grant: site acquisition, site development, building construction, utility extension, offsite water tower construction). **This project has not been announced**.
- 12. <u>Campbell County</u>: **Timken Corporation** will expand its existing facility in Campbell County. Timken is a manufacturer of bearings, alloy steels, and related products, and will create 50 new jobs. Investment will total \$10.3 million (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: site improvements and building construction). This project has been announced.

For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the second quarter of the 2006 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to Tazewell County for Clinch River Forest Products; the City of Norfolk for Trader Electronic Media; Henry County for Texturing Services; James City County for Avid Medical; Arlington County for AES Corporation; Washington County for Mid-Mountain Foods; and Prince William County for Mediatech. Actual disbursements totaled \$2,957,500.
