TO: THE HONORABLE TIMOTHY M. KAINE, GOVERNOR OF VIRGINIA, AND THE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Pursuant to the provisions of the Code of Virginia Title 59, Chapter 29, Section 59.1-369 relating to horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering, it is my privilege and pleasure to submit herewith the 2005 Annual Report of the Virginia Racing Commission.

The pari-mutuel horse racing industry in Virginia represents an important segment of the Commonwealth's economy not only from the operations of Colonial Downs and its satellite wagering facilities, but also through the agribusiness activity represented by the breeding, training and related support activities for race horses throughout the Commonwealth.

In 2005, with the addition of new satellite wagering facilities in Martinsville and Chesapeake, Colonial Downs had eight facilities open in south central and western Virginia. A ninth facility was opened in Scott County near the Bristol, TN boarder on January 18, 2006. Additional purse money being generated at the new facilities will provide more live racing days in future years at the New Kent racetrack from both thoroughbred and standardbred (harness) owners and breeders.

Colonial Downs and Virginia continue to receive national attention with the introduction of the Jacobs Entertainment Grand Slam of Grass. In 2006, two legs of the four-race series will be run at Colonial Downs-the \$1,000,000 Colonial Cup and the \$1,000,000 Virginia Derby. The goal is to grow the races to a level that ranks the two events among the top five sports events held in Virginia each year

The Racing Commission remains committed to insuring the integrity of racing for its participants and patrons and appreciates the support it has received from the Administration and the General Assembly.

ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMISSION

Title 59, Chapter 29, known as The Racing Act," became effective on January 1, 1989. It vested the Virginia Racing Commission with control of all horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering that is conducted in the Commonwealth. The Act was contingent on approval by Virginia voters at the 1988 General Election.

Horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering is permitted in the Commonwealth for "the promotion, sustenance and growth of a native industry, in a manner consistent with the health, safety and welfare of the people."

The Racing Commission is a regulatory board vested with plenary power to prescribe regulations and conditions under which racing and wagering shall be conducted, so as to maintain horse racing in the Commonwealth of the highest quality and free of any corrupt, incompetent, dishonest or unprincipled practices and to maintain in such racing complete honesty and integrity.

The 2004 General Assembly amended The Racing Act to permit up to 10 satellite wagering facilities in the Commonwealth, an increase of four. In November 2004, Colonial Downs and the horse racing industry joined forces on five referenda that are required before a facility can be built in a community. Three of the referenda passed—in Westmoreland, Henry and Scott counties. Referenda in Manassas Park and Greene County did not pass.

During 2005, two new satellite wagering facilities were opened in Virginia. In Henry County, the state's seventh facility was opened in Martinsville on August 15, 2005. A second facility was opened in Chesapeake on October 12, 2005 in the Indian River Road Shopping Center. The state's ninth facility opened on January 18, 2006 in Scott County near the Virginia boarder with Bristol, TN.

In 2003, a new statute was enacted requiring the Commission to license and regulate advance deposit account wagering companies that have been operating in Virginia. As of December 31, 2005, three account wagering licenses had been granted. The first license went to Colonial Downs' PhoneBet. TVG began operating in April 2005 and XpressBet was added in May 2005. Two additional license applications are on file with the Commission and approvals are still pending.

In 2005, a total of \$12,691,398 in wagers was processed through the three account wagering companies. XpressBet handled the most, \$4,670,810, followed by TVG at \$4,080,824 and Colonial Downs/Phone Bet at \$3,939,674.

In 2005, the General Assembly provided additional funding to the Commission to be used as grants to support programs for the promotion, sustenance and growth of horse racing and breeding in the Commonwealth. Approximately \$180,000 has been carried over for use in 2006.

ABOUT COLONIAL DOWNS

It has been more than nine (9) years since the owners of Colonial Downs brought parimutuel horse racing to Virginia. Satellite wagering facilities were opened in Chesapeake and Richmond in 1996.

But it wasn't until September 1, 1997 that Colonial Downs staged its first live meet—30 days of thoroughbred racing. Harness racing joined the schedule in 1998 and since that time both breeds have run annual meets at the New Kent facility.

As stated in § 59.1-364 of the Code of Virginia, horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering is permitted in the Commonwealth for the promotion, sustenance and growth of a native industry. As a result, the stakeholders in Virginia have worked extremely well together to build the horse breeding and racing industries. Quality racing has always been the goal, striving to build on the established horse industry in the Commonwealth.

Now owned by Jeffrey and Richard Jacobs' Jacobs Entertainment, Colonial Downs has developed a reputation as the thoroughbred turf racing capital of the nation. Typically more than 80% of the thoroughbred races run at Colonial Downs are on the 180-foot wide Secretariat Turf Course named after Virginia's famous Triple Crown winner.

In 2005 Jacobs Entertainment established the Grand Slam of Grass, a series of four turf races run at three different racetracks. Two of the races are run at Colonial Downs—the Colonial Cup that carried a purse of \$500,000 in 2005, and the Virginia Derby at \$750,000. The third race is the Secretariat Stakes, run at Arlington Park, and the \$2,000,000 John Deere Breeders Cup Turf.

Jacobs Entertainment has announced that in 2006, the Colonial Cup and Virginia Derby will carry purses of \$1,000,000 each. A panel of experts reviews all stakes races run in the United States and has awarded the Virginia Derby Grade 2 status for 2006.

In 2005, a Virginia record one-day pari-mutuel handle of \$3,775,461 was established on Virginia Derby Day. The previous mark of \$3,084,466 was set in 2004, indicative of the growth in popularity of Virginia Derby Day.

The standardbred (harness) industry has also tried to bring quality racing to the Commonwealth. Virginia was the host of the 1998 Breeders Crown races, harness racing's championship event. It was televised on ESPN.

Annually, the harness meet features a one-turn mile for most of its races. As a result a number of record times have been established in Virginia. The highlight of the harness meet is a day filled with races to showcase Virginia bred or owned horses.

ABOUT COLONIAL DOWNS

For the horse racing industry in Virginia, 2005 once again was a very good year. Among the highlights are:

- The state-wide pari-mutuel handle set a record of \$151,758,202, an increase of 4.6%;
- A total of 665,555 attended the races at the track and satellite wagering facilities;
- Two new satellite wagering facilities were opened—in Martinsville, Chesapeake and a third new facility opened in Scott County in January 2006;
- Two additional licenses, for XpressBet and TVG, to operate advance deposit account wagering in Virginia under the jurisdiction of the Commission were granted.

As a result of the efforts in 2004 and 2005, horse racing in Virginia is able to expand live racing days in 2006 to 42 for thoroughbreds and 36 for standardbreds. Additional live racing days are vital to the growth of the horse racing and breeding industry in the state.



ABOUT THE BREEDER'S FUNDS

Funded by a 1% takeout of all wagering conducted in Virginia, funds have been established for both thoroughbred and standardbred horses, their breeders and owners.

For 2005, a record \$1,176,374 was generated for the thoroughbred breeders' fund bringing the nine-year total to \$9,081,068.

Most of the thoroughbred breeders' fund money is being distributed during the annual live meet at Colonial Downs, including a 50% bonus for Virginia-breds earning purse money in open competition.

In 2005, Virginia became one of the few states that allots thoroughbred owners' awards for horses that win races anywhere in the United States.

Harness racing, both live and simulcasting, accounts for more than 20% of total wagering in Virginia. As a result, \$2,263,435 as been generated for the standardbred breeders' fund in the past nine years. In addition to a viable stakes programs, standardbreds also receive bonuses for placing in open competition.

The Racing Commission has contracted with the Virginia Thoroughbred Association to administer the thoroughbred breeders' fund program and the Virginia Harness Horse Association to manage the standardbred breeders' fund.



- proper recording and reporting of all transactions, in all material respects, in the Commonwealth Accounting and Reporting System;
- matters involving internal control and the Commission's operations that we have communicated to management in the Audit Findings and Recommendations section of this report; and
- no instances of noncompliance with applicable laws and regulations.

We recommend that the Commission:

- update its operating policies and procedures to reflect its current operations including both manual and automated processes and
- improve the documentation of its process for conducting off-track betting facility inspections.

We have audited the financial records and operations of the Virginia Racing Commission for the year ended June 30, 2005. We conducted our audit in accordance with Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Audit Objectives

Our audit's primary objectives were to evaluate the accuracy of the Commission's financial transactions as recorded in the Commonwealth Accounting and Reporting System, review the adequacy of the Commission's internal controls, and test compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

Audit Scope and Methodology

The Commission's management has responsibility for establishing and maintaining internal control and complying with applicable laws and regulations. Internal control is a process designed to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance regarding the reliability of financial reporting, effectiveness and efficiency of operations, and compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

We gained an understanding of the overall internal controls, both automated and manual, sufficient to plan the audit. We considered materiality and control risk in determining the nature and extent of our audit procedures. Our review encompassed controls over the following significant activities, classes of transactions, and account balances:

Contractual services expenses Facility inspection process Incentive payments License and permit fees Payroll expenses

ntive payments Tax and pari-mutuel wagering revenues

We performed audit tests to determine whether the Commission's controls were adequate, had been placed in operation, and were being followed. Our audit also included tests of compliance with provisions of applicable laws and regulations. Our audit procedures included inquiries of appropriate personnel and observation of the Commission's operations. We inspected documents including reconciliations, deposit slips and certificates, wagering reports provided by Colonial Downs, revenue summary reports, timesheets, contracts, and off-track satellite facility review sheets. We reviewed the Commission's Board minutes and

appropriate sections of the <u>Code of Virginia</u> and the 2005 Virginia Acts of Assembly. We tested transactions and performed analytical procedures, including budgetary and trend analyses.

Conclusions

We found that the Commission properly stated, in all material respects, the amounts recorded and reported in the Commonwealth Accounting and Reporting System. The Commission records its financial transactions on the cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The financial information presented in this report came directly from the Commonwealth Accounting and Reporting System.

We noted certain matters involving internal control and its operation that require management's attention and corrective action. These matters are described in the section entitled "Audit Findings and Recommendations."

The results of our tests of compliance with applicable laws and regulations disclosed no instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under <u>Government Auditing Standards</u>.

EXIT CONFERENCE

We discussed this report with management on October 20, 2005. Management's response is included at the end of this report.

This report is intended for the information and use of the Governor and General Assembly, management, and the citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia and is a public record.

AUDIT FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Update Operating Policies and Procedures

The Virginia Racing Commission should update its operating policies and procedures to reflect current operations and include both manual and automated processes. The lack of adequately documented policies and procedures increases the likelihood that errors and improper payments could occur and go undetected. Further, documenting critical operating policies and procedures will ensure continuity of operations in the event of the loss of key personnel and in the hiring of new personnel to assist in operations. Having these policies will assist management in ensuring uniformity and consistency in day-to-day operations, analyzing performance, and recording transactions in the Commission's accounting systems.

While the Commission has documented some of its operating policies and procedures, it has not updated those policies and procedures to reflect changes in its operations. Further, the Commission's policies and procedures do not fully address some of the manual processes performed by the Commission's staff including daily and monthly reconciliations and its procedures for managing its responsibilities for the human resources and payroll functions. The Commission has desk procedures to address some of these activities; however, they need to incorporate these procedures into a comprehensive policies and procedures manual.

The documentation of accounting policies and procedures should be readily available to all employees with relevant responsibilities to ensure that accounting and administrative controls are operating as intended. The policies and procedures should delineate the authority and responsibility of all employees, especially the authority to authorize transactions, and indicate which employees are to perform the specific procedures.

The Commission has undergone changes in its operations in recent years. Due to these changes and the increased workload of staff, the Commission has not updated its policies and procedures. Further, the Commission is currently working with the Virginia Information Technologies Agency to update its internal accounting system, which may result in further changes to its operations. The Commission plans to complete its system enhancements by June 2007. Before that time, the Commission should focus its efforts on documenting its policies and procedures not significantly impacted by the system upgrade and ensure its documentation is sufficient for all critical operations.

Improve Documentation of Facility Inspections

The Commission should improve the documentation of its process for conducting off-track betting facility inspections. The Commission should document its process for determining the frequency of inspections, the responsibilities of its staff performing the inspections including the areas that should be covered in the inspection, the minimum required documentation of the results of the inspection including any violations noted, and follow-up procedures that should be performed related to violations.

As a part of their regulatory oversight, the Commission performs inspections of licensed off-track betting facilities. The Commission's internal policy is to perform monthly inspections of the facilities. However, during the racing season, it does not have enough staff to perform monthly inspections.

The Commission currently has a checklist that it uses to document the results of the inspections. However, in our review, we noted that the staff performing the inspections do not consistently document the results of the inspections on the checklist. For example, Section 59.1-387 of the <u>Code of Virginia</u> requires that off-track betting facility employees possess a permit issued by the Commission. Based on our review of a sample of inspection reports, there were instances where, due to a lack of documentation, we could not determine if the inspection staff reviewed this requirement.

Further, in some cases we could not determine whether the Commission adequately followed-up on and penalized facilities that had employees without permits. The Commission's policy with regard to addressing permit violations is to require the facility to remove the employee without the permit from the work schedule. However, in most cases when the inspector noted employees with expired permits at a facility, there was no documentation as to whether the employee renewed the permit during the site visit or whether the inspector requested that the employees removal from the work schedule.

AGENCY HIGHLIGHTS

The Virginia Racing Commission controls and prescribes regulations and conditions for all horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering privileges in the Commonwealth. It licenses horse racetracks and satellite facilities and ensures that all their employees have valid Commission permits. The Commission also issues permits to anyone associated with horse racing including horse owners, trainers, jockeys, grooms, veterinarians, and blacksmiths.

Pari-mutuel horse racing began in the Commonwealth in September 1997 at Colonial Downs, a privately held racetrack in New Kent County. The <u>Code of Virginia</u> permits up to ten satellite wagering facilities. Currently, there are six satellite facilities operated by Colonial Downs, which are located in Brunswick, Chesapeake, Hampton, Richmond (two), and Vinton. Voters approved referenda for three additional facilities in November 2004. The Commission monitors each of these facilities as a part of their regulatory oversight.

The <u>Code of Virginia</u> directs the distribution of the funds in the horse racing wagering pools. The percentage distribution varies based on factors such as the type of wagering, whether the race took place within or outside of the Commonwealth, and whether the wagering occurred at the racetrack or at a satellite facility. The Commonwealth retains as a license tax a portion of the wagering pools ranging from 0.75 to 2.25 percent as directed by the <u>Code of Virginia</u>. All revenues received by the Commission go to a special fund known as the State Racing Operations Fund. The Appropriation Act requires the Commission to transfer any funds in excess of the Commission's operating expenses to the General Fund of the Commonwealth.

The <u>Code of Virginia</u> also created the Virginia Breeders Fund to support an incentive program to foster the industry of breeding racehorses in Virginia. It receives a one percent distribution of the horse racing wagering conducted in the Commonwealth. The Commission contracted with the Virginia Thoroughbred Association and the Virginia Harness Horse Association to manage the fund.

Below are the results of the fiscal year 2005 financial operations of the Virginia Racing Commission. The Commission increased its budgeted revenue and expenses over the prior years in anticipation of additional race days and the opening of a new satellite wagering facility by December 2004. However, there were not as many additional race days as anticipated and the opening of the new satellite wagering facility did not occur until August 2005. These changes resulted in the variances between budgeted and actual taxes and pari-mutuel wagering revenues and contractual service expenses. In addition, the Commission did not use its appropriation for marketing expenses to ensure it had adequate funds to make transfers required by the Appropriation Act. The Appropriation Act allows the Commission to carry forward up to \$250,000 of its marketing budget to fiscal year 2006 as long as it makes its required transfer to the General Fund.

On behalf of the Virginia Racing Commission and in my capacity as Executive Secretary, I have reviewed the findings and recommendations provided by the Auditor of Public Accounts in this report.

I generally concur with the findings and recommendations for the audit review for the period July 1, 2004-June 30, 2005 and offer the following additional comments:

- 1. All of the appropriate internal policies and procedures for the operation of the Racing Commission are in place. We have documentation of all operating polices and procedures except in the areas of daily and monthly reconciliations including the processing of bills to be sent to DOA for payment, preparation of payroll information being sent to DHRM for payment and inspections of the satellite wagering facilities. Our staff will develop the appropriate documentation in those areas by February 1, 2006.
- 2. Our computerized operating system was developed by DIT in 1997 and was updated prior to live racing in 2003. Effective December 31, 2006, our system no longer will be supported by Oracle and we are working with VITA to upgrade the system prior to the start of live racing in June 2007. We will make any adjustments in our operating system that the auditor deems appropriate as part of that changeover to the new system.
