Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the third quarter of the 2007 fiscal year as required by **Chapter 3**, **Item 119.G.**

As of March 31, 2007, a total of \$167,998,857 had been appropriated to the Fund. This amount excludes legislative mandates and monies which were unallotted after the original allocation. As of March 31, 2007, the cash balance was \$33,843,434, and the balance available for future commitments totaled \$18,485,934. However, when the GOF preapprovals made by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade are taken into account, the available balance is reduced to \$1,260,934. Grants awarded since the inception of the fund total 376.

For the third quarter of the 2007 fiscal year, ended March 31, 2007, a total of \$2,995,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist seven projects relocating to or expanding in the state. Total job creation of these projects was 1,295, while investment totaled \$340.9 million. Summaries on these projects follow:

- 1. <u>Culpeper County</u>: **Terremark Worldwide, Inc.**, a leading operator of integrated internet exchanges and a global provider of managed information technology infrastructure for government and the private sector, will locate a new facility in Culpeper County. Terremark will create 250 new jobs and invest \$270 million (amount of grant: \$1,000,000; use of grant: building infrastructure). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>Smyth County</u>: **Wellborn Cabinet, Inc.**, a manufacturer of cabinets, will locate a new facility in Smyth County. With an investment totaling \$3 million, this location will create 100 new jobs (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 3. Project Not Yet Announced.
- 4. <u>City of Harrisonburg</u>: **Ariake U.S.A., Inc.** will expands its existing facility in the City of Harrisonburg. Ariake is a manufacturer of natural seasonings and will create 25 new jobs. Investment will total \$18 million (amount of grant: \$50,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
- 5. <u>City of Danville</u>: **Nestle** will expand its existing facility in the City of Danville. Nestle will create 50 new jobs and invest \$20 million (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 6. <u>City of Bedford</u>: **The Matrixx Group**, a manufacturer of thermoplastic compounded products, will locate a new facility in the City of Bedford. The Matrixx Group will create 40 jobs and invest \$9.85 million (amount of grant: \$175,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.

For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the third quarter of the 2007 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to the City of Staunton for Specialty Blades; the Town of West Point for U.S. Components; Wythe County for Mid-Atlantic Manufacturing and Hydraulics; Roanoke County for Novozymes Biologicals; Russell County for Northrop Grumman; and the City of Danville for Corning. Actual disbursements totaled \$1,025,000.
