Allocation of Transportation Funds

In accordance with Item 427 C1 of Chapter 3 of the 2006 Acts of Assembly, Special Session I, this memorandum will certify that all available federal transportation funds will be used in accordance with applicable federal law and in support of the transportation policy goals included in that Chapter.

On June 21, 2007, the Commonwealth Transportation Board will consider adoption of the FY 2008-2013 Six-Year Improvement Program as well as the annual budgets of the Department of Transportation and Department of Rail and Public Transportation. The working drafts of these budgets and Program were presented to the Board in May and five public hearings on the Program are scheduled: May 16, May 22, May 23, May 29, and May 31, 2007.

For FY 2008, \$143 million in federal funds have been budgeted for highway maintenance purposes. This is the third year in which federal funding has been allocated for maintenance. Maintenance of Virginia's existing infrastructure is our first priority and this step has been taken to ensure that we can continue to meet our growing resource requirements for maintenance.
