Inpatient Acute Care Facilities

- 1 Acute care facilities not serving children due to low census and lack of staff
- 1 facility did not report
- 1 facility cited low census due to staffing
- 1 facility indicated only admitting TDO's until other resource is found
- Acute care facilities reported 140 fewer staffed than licensed beds

Residential Treatment Facilities:

- 2 facilities did not report data
- Residential facilities reported 481fewer staffed than licensed beds
- 7 of the 25 residential facilities reported data for youth under the age of 14
- 1 facility cited a consent agreement as the reason for 0 placements
- 6 facilities cited census as the reason for the difference in licensed and staffed beds
- 1 facility reported staffing and space as the reason for low census
