Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the fourth quarter of the 2007 fiscal year as required by **Chapter 3**, **Item 119.G.**

As of June 30, 2007, a total of \$167,998,857 had been appropriated to the Fund. This amount excludes legislative mandates and monies which were unallotted after the original allocation. As of June 30, 2007, the cash balance was \$35,768,434, and the balance available for future commitments totaled \$20,035,934. However, when the GOF preapprovals made by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade are taken into account, the available balance is reduced to \$1,785,934. Grants awarded since the inception of the fund total 379.

For the fourth quarter of the 2007 fiscal year, ended June 30, 2007, a total of \$700,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist four projects relocating to or expanding in the state. Total job creation of these projects was 462, while investment totaled \$46.2 million. Summaries on these projects follow:

- 1. <u>Augusta County</u>: **Hershey**, a manufacturer of chocolate and non-chocolate confectionery products, will expand its existing facility in Augusta County. Hershey will create 150 new jobs and invest \$25 million (amount of grant: \$200,000; use of grant: infrastructure improvements). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>Charlotte County</u>: **Alderman Rail Car Services** will locate a new facility in Charlotte County. Alderman refurbishes and repairs railcars. With an investment totaling \$3.5 million, this location will create 110 new jobs (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: site preparation). This project has been announced.
- 3. <u>Smyth/Washington Counties</u>: **Gates Corporation**, a manager of hoses, belts, and hydraulic systems, will locate a new facility in the Glade Highlands shell building, which is owned by the Smyth-Washington Industrial Facilities Authority. Investment will total \$8.7 million, with 172 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$300,000; use of grant: building upfits). This project has been announced.
- 4. <u>Smyth County</u>: **American Wood Fibers** will expand its existing facility in Smyth County. American Wood Fibers is a producer of wood flour and wood by-products and will create 30 new jobs. Investment will total \$9 million (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: site and infrastructure development). This project has been announced.

For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the fourth quarter of the 2007 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to Montgomery County for Federal Mogul; Orange County for Diversified Information Technologies; and the City of Danville for Nestle. Actual disbursements totaled \$475,000.
