






Our Mission

"The Commission is established for the purposes of determining the appropriate recipients of moneys in the Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Fund and causing distribution of such moneys for the purposes provided in this chapter, including using moneys in the Fund to (i) provide payments to tobacco farmers as compensation for the adverse economic effects resulting from loss of investment in specialized tobacco equipment and barns and lost tobacco production opportunities associated with a decline in quota and (ii) revitalize tobacco dependent communities."

Section 3.1-1107, Code of Virginia



Danville Community College's Regional Center for Advanced Technology & Training (RCATT) was established with support from Education grants and is now located in a new facility in the region's Cyber Park. In the 2006-07 school year RCATT served 60 area companies by conducting assessments of nearly 1,800 prospective employees, and providing advanced manufacturing skills training for 3,700 students in topics such as robotics, polymers, prototyping and lean manufacturing.

To the Governor and Members of the General Assembly of Virginia:

It is my privilege to present the enclosed report from the Virginia Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission for the year ending June 30, 2007. This report covers our eighth year of operation since the Commission was created by the 1999 General Assembly.

First among our original statutory duties was the indemnification of tobacco farmers against the adverse effects of a decline in quota. I am pleased to report that in fiscal year 2007, we made available \$15.1 million to growers and quota holders, bringing the total to \$226.9 million, or 74% of the amount necessary to fully indemnify Virginia's tobacco farmers. The Commission remains committed to 100% indemnification by the year 2015, and is on-time and on-budget to reach this goal.

Second among our original statutory duties was the revitalization of tobacco-dependent communities. I am pleased to report that in fiscal year 2007 alone, the Commission has successfully invested over \$54.8 million into economic development projects in 34 counties and 7 cities in Virginia, bringing educational opportunities, jobs, and capital investment to the tobacco region that would not otherwise have been possible. Employment for citizens and a growing tax base continues to emerge as evidence of the diverse efforts of the Commission to help change an age-old economy.

On behalf of the Commission, I am grateful for your continued support and understanding of our mission and look forward to a continued partnership with you in bringing renewed prosperity to this area of the Commonwealth that we are privileged to serve.

Fund Descriptions / Priorities

Using proceeds from the annual Master Settlement Agreement and Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Endowment established from securitization proceeds, the Commission made available \$15.1 million for indemnification and awarded \$54.8 million for economic revitalization grants for the tobacco-growing region in fiscal year 2007. The revitalization aspect of the mission is accomplished through seven grant programs that make awards to local governments, government entities (such as Planning District Commissions and Industrial Development Authorities), and non-profit organizations. Awards are guided by the Commission's Strategic Plan, recommended by a standing Committee for each program, and monitored by Commission staff. The Plan's Funding Policies call for projects to maximize leveraging from applicants and other partner organizations, to give preference to projects that have regional participation, and to assist those projects that generate the most significant outcomes for the residents and localities in the tobacco region.

Regional Economic Development

Regional economic development funds for Southside and Southwest are designated for projects that will expand and diversify the economic base in the tobacco-dependent region, creating new employment opportunities and reducing dependence on tobacco-related activities. The funds are used to develop industrial sites, improve water and sewer infrastructure, establish training facilities, and develop tourism infrastructure. Southside localities and organizations received grants totaling \$19.8 million, and Southwest received grants totaling \$3.7 million.

Education

Education funds are awarded for various projects that will create a world-class workforce in the tobacco region, including scholarships, community college programs, workforce training, and vocational and adult education programs. Grants totaling \$13.6 million were awarded this fiscal year for educational projects, including \$2.8 million to the tobacco region's seven community colleges for continuing programs, and \$3.8 million in scholarships and loans for tobacco region residents who are attending four-year degree-granting institutions.

Technology

Technology grants are awarded to develop regional fiber-optic "backbone" networks that will provide open access to high-speed, redundant connectivity at an affordable cost to regional users. These networks will allow the tobacco region to grow businesses that require this connectivity and to more effectively market the region as a location for business development.

Grants totaling \$6.1 million were awarded to build infrastructure in the tobacco region.

Innovation

Innovation grants include three areas of funding: Special Projects, Tobacco Region Opportunity Fund (TROF), and Agribusiness.

Grants are awarded under the **Special Projects** fund for projects that benefit several localities within one region or have the potential to have a significant impact on the economy of the tobacco region as a whole. These funds are provided for projects such as research facilities and regional business development that impact the larger geographic area. Special projects totaling \$4.2 million were funded this fiscal year.


TROF was created to revitalize the economies of the tobacco region through incentive grants to companies that will create new jobs and bring new private capital investment of at least \$1 million to localities within the region. This fund is successfully assisting communities by diversifying their economic base and reducing dependency on tobacco-related employment. The Commission works closely with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to leverage the Governor's Opportunity Fund. The Commission made \$6.1 in commitments to help attract 26 new companies, create 2,071 new jobs, and provide \$822.5 million in capital investment to the tobacco region.

Agribusiness grants are awarded to assist tobacco producers and the tobacco region's agricultural community in diversifying into new production opportunities and developing value-added enterprises. Six agribusiness projects received grants totaling \$1.3 million for programs and facilities.

Indemnification

Total quota losses for a given year are calculated to be the difference between that year and the average quota for 1995-98. According to the *Code of Virginia*, the total value of quota in Virginia is estimated to be \$1.2 billion, and the Commission has adopted a rate of \$12 per pound to compensate for those losses (to be divided between producers and quota owners). Annually, the Commission determines an amount to be made available for indemnification of these losses. From its inception through the end of fiscal year 2007, the Commission has made available for indemnification \$226.9 million, leaving a remaining obligation of \$81.3 million for losses through 2002, the effective year of the federal tobacco quota buyout. Actual amounts paid are determined by verification forms submitted to the Commission by producers and quota owners.




