Annual Training Report

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Introduction

Pursuant to Chapter 814 of the 2001 Virginia Acts of Assembly, Item 319 paragraph N4 of the Budget Bill requires the following:

"The Department of Medical Assistance Services, in cooperation with the State Executive Council, shall provide initial and ongoing training to local Comprehensive Services Act teams on the procedures for use of Medicaid for residential treatment foster care services, including, but not limited to, procedures for determining eligibility, billing, and reimbursement plus related reported requirements.

The Department shall include in this training, information on the proper utilization of inpatient and outpatient mental health services as covered by the Medicaid State Plan. The Department shall report annually, by June 30, to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees on the results of the training program.

The report shall include the number of local team representatives attending formal training programs offered by the Department; the number of technical assistance requests responded to by the department; and the type and amounts of training materials made available to the local teams."

Technical Assistance

For Fiscal Year 2008, DMAS received approximately 800 technical assistance requests via telephone, fax, letter, and email from interested parties regarding the Residential Treatment and Treatment Foster Care Programs. These requests were documented through phone logs and electronic storage. These requests included a wide variety of questions from issues involving covered services to claims and billing.

This is the eighth report, conveying the status of the Department's training and technical assistance provided to the CSA community.

Medicaid Specific Mental Health Services for Children

During Fiscal Year 2008, the Department of Medical Assistance Services conducted thirteen training sessions regionally throughout Virginia for the Comprehensive Services Act (CSA) teams and Medicaid Providers.

Four of the training sessions were conducted in the fall of 2007 and nine were conducted in the spring of 2008.

The four November 2007 training sessions on, <u>Treatment Foster Care-Case Management and Residential Treatment Facility-Level C</u> had a total of 153 attendees. Information included Medicaid services for Children available to both CSA and non-CSA children, Level C Residential Treatment for Children and Adolescents, Treatment Foster Care-Case Management, and Billing for Treatment Foster Care-Case Management and Residential Treatment Facility-

Level C. The participants had an opportunity for several question and answer periods throughout the training events and received handouts, which augmented the training sessions. (See Attachment A)

Medicaid Children's Community Mental Health Services

The four March 2008 training sessions on the <u>Medicaid Children's Mental Health Program</u> had a total of 138 attendees. Information was provided on the new Children's Mental Health Program which began December 1, 2007. The program components for transition coordination service and case management were explained in detail. The participants had an opportunity for several question and answer periods throughout the training events and received handouts, which augmented the training sessions (See Attachment B).

The five April 2008 training sessions on Community Mental Health Rehabilitative Services for Children had a total of 506 attendees. Services available to both CSA and non-CSA children, Level A and B Group Homes, Intensive In-Home Services, Therapeutic Day Treatment for Children and Adolescents and Billing Guidelines were included. The participants had an opportunity for several question and answer periods throughout the training events and received handouts, which augmented the training sessions (See Attachment B). Presentations for Intensive In-Homes Services and Level A and B Group Homes were recorded and posted to WebEx. Post cards with the presentation web links were sent to all Intensive In-Home and Group Home Level A and B providers.
