RE: Annual Report on Commonwealth Agency and Department Reporting of Small, Womenand Minority-owned Business Procurement

The Virginia Department of Minority Business Enterprise ("DMBE") was established and granted statutory powers under §§ 2.2-1400 et seq. of the *Code of Virginia*. Section 2.2-1402 of the Code grants certain powers and duties to the DMBE, which specifically includes, *inter alia*, the duty to "[i]mplement any remediation or enhancement measure for small, women-, or minority-owned business as may be authorized by the Governor pursuant to subsection C of § 2.2-4310 and develop regulations, consistent with prevailing law, for program implementation."

As part of this duty, the DMBE Director is required to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the participation of small, women- and minority-owned ("SWaM") businesses in state procurement as well as identify state entities failing to submit annual progress reports on SWaM procurement as required by § 2.2-4310 of the *Code of Virginia*. More specifically, § 2.2-1405 indicates that:

The Director shall report on or before November 1 of each year, to the Governor and the General Assembly the identity of the state departments and agencies failing to submit annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement required by § 2.2-4310, and the nature and extend of such lack of compliance. The annual report shall include recommendations on the ways to improve compliance with the provisions of § 2.2-4310 and such other related matters as the Director deems appropriate.



The Virginia Public Procurement Act's anti-discrimination policy in procurement, § 2.2-4310(B) of the *Code of Virginia*, requires that:

All public bodies shall establish programs consistent with this chapter to facilitate the participation of small business and businesses owned by women and minorities in procurement transactions. The programs established shall be in writing and shall comply with the provisions of any enhancement or remedial measures authorized by the Governor pursuant to subsection C or, where applicable, by the chief executive of a local governing body pursuant to § 15.2-965.1, and shall include specific plans to achieve any goals established therein. State agencies shall submit annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement to the Department of Minority Business Enterprise in a form specified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise.

Further, Executive Order No. 33 (2006) requires that state entities and institutions with procurement responsibilities develop and submit an annual "SWaM Plan" (or also known as agency progress reports on SWaM) to the DMBE by September 1 of each year. As such, the Annual Report of the Virginia Department of Minority Business Enterprise of the state agencies and departments failing to submit annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement, as required by § 2.2-1405 of the *Code of Virginia*, is attached. The reporting requirement applies to any authority, board, department, instrumentality, institution, agency or other unit of state government, as defined in § 2.2-1401 of the *Code of Virginia*, and does not include any county, city, or town in the Commonwealth.

## **REPORT OF THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE**

DMBE is pleased to announce the continuing reporting compliance rate of ninety-nine percent (99%) for state entities and institutions. This achievement is attributable in part to the efforts of the General Assembly and our Governor to promote the SWaM Procurement Initiative and to improve access to Virginia's business opportunities for small, women- and minority-owned businesses in state procurement.

With the exception of one entity—the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation—all state agencies and departments listed in Table 1 were in compliance by submitting their annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement for Fiscal Year 2008 to the DMBE. <sup>i</sup> To achieve one hundred percent (100%) compliance of all state entities, DMBE recommends that the Governor and the General Assembly encourage the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation to submit an Annual SWaM Plan for Fiscal Year 2009 or at least

provide a synopsis of the entity's intent to promote the SWaM Procurement Initiative in its operations.

Finally, the DMBE is pleased to report to you that state entities and institutions were able to complete and submit their annual SWaM Plans/Progress Reports to the DMBE via the Internet. This step by the DMBE ensures consistency and ease of reporting, efficiency, and the implementation of budget-conscious and environmentally-friendly efforts.

## Endnote

The only entity that did not submit their annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement for Fiscal Year 2007 was the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation ("VTSF"). The VTSF provides funding to grant recipients throughout the Commonwealth for local community programs in an effort to prevent tobacco use by youth. Grant recipients including non-profit organizations, faith groups, schools, and other community groups that reach children of all ages.

The VTSF is a twenty-three member appointed board as follows:

- Two state delegates, one representing rural interests and one urban, are appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates.
- Two state senators, one representing rural interests and one urban, are appointed by the Senate Privileges and Elections Committee.

The Governor appoints the remaining nineteen members, consisting of:

- Five designated representatives of public health organizations, such as the American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, American Lung Association of Virginia, Medical Society of Virginia, and the Virginia Thoracic Society
- · Four health professionals in the fields of oncology, cardiology, pulmonary medicine, and pediatrics
- Eight citizens, including two youth
- Commissioner of the Department of Health or his designee
- Chairman of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board or his designee
