

Compensation Board Mental Illness in Jails Preliminary Report (2007)

Authority: Virginia Acts of Assembly, 2008 Session, Chapter 879 §53.1-83.1, §53.1-84 and §53.1-85, Code of Virginia Item 70, Paragraph L. "The Compensation Board shall provide an annual report on the number and diagnoses of inmates with mental illnesses in local and regional jails, the treatment services provided, and expenditures on jail mental health programs. The report shall be prepared in cooperation with the Virginia Sheriff's Association, the Virginia Association of Regional Jails, the Virginia Association of Community Services Boards, and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, and shall be coordinated with the data submissions required for the annual jail cost report. Copies of this report shall be provided by October 1, 2008, and each year thereafter to the Governor and the Chairman of the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees."

Executive Summary: A survey of mental illness in Virginia jails was developed by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS) and staff of the Senate Finance Committee. The Compensation Board posted the mental health survey on its website in October 2007 for completion by Compensation Board funded local and regional jails. With the support of the Virginia Sheriffs' Association and the Virginia Association of Regional Jails, the Compensation Board received completed surveys from all local and regional jails. The goal of the survey was to provide information to the Virginia General Assembly, the Compensation Board and the DMHMRSAS regarding jail resource needs for appropriately managing inmates with mental illness. Survey questions directed jail personnel to report data as reflected for given time periods, including on October 16, 2007, October 14 through October 20, 2007, or for FY2007. The data provided in this report is reflective only of local and state responsible inmates housed in local and regional jails and does not include federal inmates or contract inmates from other states. The data in this report is as reported to the Compensation Board by the local and regional jails in their 2007 mental health survey. To ensure the accuracy and completeness of future reports in meeting the requirements of the Virginia Acts of Assembly, the Compensation Board is currently establishing a task force to determine a comprehensive method of capturing mental illness and treatment data in local and regional jails on an annual basis.

Population & Mental Illness Statistics

Based upon survey reporting by jails for the date of October 16, 2007 there were 7,114 State Responsible and 20,191 Local Responsible inmates confined in local and regional jails in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The following reflects the number of inmates housed on October 16 and diagnosed with mental illness, the type of disorder, and statewide percentages.





Figure 1: Number & Diagnoses of Inmates with Mental Illness

- There were a total of 4,879 inmates known to be mentally ill.
- In addition, there were **322** inmates diagnosed as mentally retarded.
- **17.87%** of the local and regional jail inmate population was known to be mentally ill (not including those inmates diagnosed as mentally retarded).

Admission Screenings & Assessments

54 out of **67** jails conduct a mental health screening for all inmates upon admission to the jail. The type of individual conducting mental health screenings may differ between facilities.

Figure 2: Provider of jail mental health screenings.




Comprehensive mental health assessments of inmates are also conducted, as follows:

- **25** jails conduct assessments on all inmates who receive a positive screening for mental illness.
- **26** jails conduct assessments only on inmates with acute symptoms of mental illness.
- **16** jails do not conduct assessments at all.

As with initial screenings, the type of individual conducting comprehensive mental health assessments may differ between facilities.

Housing

Data in this section is as reflected on October 16, 2007.

There is not currently a state funded Mental Health Residential Treatment Program operating within jail facilities. The housing of mentally ill inmates may therefore differ from jail to jail.

- **24 out of 67** jails have Mental Health Units or bed areas separate from the General Population.
- Jails reported that **615** additional beds would be needed to house all inmates with non-acute mental illness in mental health beds or units.
- Of the **4,879** known mentally ill inmates, **366** were housed in isolation. **37%** of mentally ill inmates housed in isolated or segregated cells were in jails without a Mental Health Unit.
- **10** jails would consider hosting a state-funded Mental Health Residential Treatment Program.

Substance Abuse

Data in this section is as reflected on October 16, 2007.

- Of the **4,879** inmates with mental illness, **2,935** had a co-occurring substance use/abuse disorder, or about **60%** of the mentally ill jail population.
- **4,895** inmates <u>without</u> mental illness were reported to have substance use/abuse disorders, representing about **18%** of the jail population.
- As illustrated later in Figure 7, **51%** of all inmates receiving jail provided treatment services are receiving group substance abuse treatment.

Mental Health Treatment Services Provided

The information provided below is for the week of October 14 through October 20, 2007.

- A total of **3,678** treatment hours were provided.
- Average treatment hours per jail was **55**.







Figure 5: Providers of Treatment





Figure 6: Type of Treatment Provided

Medication

• On this date there were **4,965** prescriptions for psychotropic medications being dispensed in local and regional jails.





Figure 8: Number and type of Psychotropic Medications Dispensed

Treatment Expenditures

The following reflects the cost of all mental health treatment, including medications, as reported by the jails for FY07. Note that some jails provided estimated or pro-rated annual costs; total figures have not been audited.

- The total cost of all psychotropic medications administered was **\$3,928,553**.
- The total cost of mental health services, excluding medication but including medical doctors and nursing, was **\$6,436,825**.
- Total cost of Mental Health Treatment was estimated at approximately **\$10.4 million** in FY07.

Conclusion & Future Measures

The 2008 Virginia Acts of Assembly language provides for an initial report to be provided in 2008. In order to provide comprehensive data regarding mental illness, including diagnoses of inmates, treatment services and expenditures, additional information must be collected from local and regional jails, and jail facilities and localities must have ample time to plan and prepare such data submissions to the Compensation Board. Consequently, the first report submission is based upon data collected in a survey of local and regional jails in October, 2007. Further details of data gleaned from the 2007 mental health survey and summarized in this report, including the survey instrument developed by DMHMRSAS and staff of the Senate Finance Committee, are available in the appendices of this document.

The Compensation Board will develop a task force comprised of sheriffs and regional jail superintendents, locality finance officials, as well as representatives of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS) and local Community Services Boards. The goal of the task force is to determine timelines for and accurate methods of data collection regarding the number and diagnoses of inmates with mental illness, treatment services provided, and expenditures on jail mental health programs. Pilot reporting will be conducted with a limited number of representative jails during FY09. By FY10 the data collection will be expanded to include all local and regional jails. The Compensation Board anticipates presenting the first evidentiary findings from all jail facilities in the fall of 2010.

The 2008 language regarding the provision of a report on mental illness issues in jails provides that the report should be coordinated with the data submissions required for the annual jail cost report. In order to synchronize the data collection and submission of these reports, a language change will be sought to provide for an annual report submission date of November 1.


