Dear Delegate Putney:

Pursuant to Chapter 3 §37.2-308, *Data Reporting on Children and Adolescents*, enclosed is the quarterly report for the period July 1 through September 30, 2008 for children and adolescents in acute psychiatric inpatient care or residential treatment. The Department has received no data from Community Policy and Management Teams (CMPT) indicating the need for residential or inpatient acute care.

There are 172 staffed acute care beds and 299 licensed acute care beds. These statistics indicate that there are more beds available than filled in the Commonwealth; units and facilities are operating at approximately 55 percent capacity on a statewide basis. Residential services providers also have more licensed beds than staffed beds. These providers are currently operating at approximately 72 percent capacity on a statewide basis. These two statistics indicate there is capacity within the private sector to admit additional children with acute and residential mental health needs.

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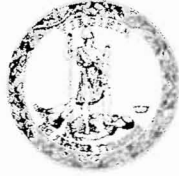
