Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the first half of the 2008 fiscal year as required by § 2.2-115(F) of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>.

For the first half of the 2008 fiscal year, ended December 31, 2007, a total of \$13,500,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist 13 projects relocating to or expanding in the state. A summary for each of these projects is enclosed. For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the first half of the 2008 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to the City of Virginia Beach for Amerigroup; Scott County for Holston Medical Group; York County for Philip Morris; Halifax County for ABB; the City of Chesapeake for American Funds; the City of Harrisonburg for Ariake; the Smyth-Washington Industrial Facilities Authority for Gates Corporation; Augusta County for Hershey; Smyth County for Wellborn Cabinet; the City of Bedford for Matrixx; the City of Richmond for MeadWestvaco; Arlington County for the Bureau of National Affairs; and Rockbridge County for Lees Commercial Carpet. Actual disbursements totaled \$6,360,000.

## PROJECT SUMMARIES

- 1. <u>City of Richmond</u>: **MeadWestvaco Corporation**, a manufacturer of packaging products, will locate its corporate headquarters in the City of Richmond. MeadWestvaco will create 400 jobs and invest \$80 million (amount of grant: \$2,000,000; use of grant: building upfits and infrastructure improvements). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>City of Staunton</u>: **Universal Impact, Inc.** will locate a new facility in the City of Staunton. Universal Impact is a manufacturer of aluminum impact extrusion products. With an investment totaling \$2.5 million, this location will create 50 new jobs (amount of grant: \$50,000; use of grant: workforce training). This project has been announced.
- 3. <u>Fairfax County</u>: **Volkswagen of America, Inc.** will locate its North American corporate headquarters in Fairfax County. Investment will total \$118 million, with 401 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$1,500,000; use of grant: infrastructure improvements and workforce training). This project has been announced.
- 4. Project Not Yet Announced.
- 5. <u>Shenandoah County</u>: **International Automotive Components**, a manufacturer of molded automotive interiors, will expand its existing facility in Shenandoah County. The company will create 60 new jobs and invest \$3 million (amount of grant: \$50,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 6. <u>City of Staunton</u>: **Carded Graphics, LLC**, a manufacturer of folded cartons, will expand its existing facility in the City of Staunton. Carded Graphics will invest \$6.5 million and create 35 new jobs (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
- 7. <u>Arlington County</u>: **GridPoint, Inc.** will locate its corporate headquarters in Arlington County. GridPoint is a provider of intelligent energy management appliances and will create 246 jobs and invest \$5 million (amount of grant: \$500,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 8. <u>Bedford County</u>: **Innovative Wireless Technologies, Inc.**, a supplier of wireless and telecommunications products, will expand its existing facility in Bedford County. With an investment totaling \$5.7 million, this expansion will create 50 new jobs (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
- 9. <u>Prince William County</u>: **Covance**, a pharmaceutical research and development laboratory, will expand its facility in Prince William County. Investment will total \$175 million, with 100 new jobs being created and retaining the existing 450 jobs for Virginia (amount of grant: \$1,000,000; use of grant: grant to the Prince William County Industrial Development Authority to assist with Covance's location). This project has been announced.

- 10. <u>Prince George County</u>: **Rolls-Royce North America** will locate an assembly and test facility for corporate and commercial aerospace engines in Prince George County. Rolls-Royce will create 100 jobs, and investment will total \$90 million (amount of grant: \$3,000,000; use of grant: site and infrastructure improvements). Please see the note in Item 11 below. This project has been announced.
- 11. Prince George County: Rolls-Royce North America will locate an aerospace advanced manufacturing facility in Prince George County. The company will create 70 new jobs and invest \$60 million (amount of grant: \$3,000,000; use of grant: site and infrastructure improvements). NOTE: Beyond the time period covered by the Performance Agreement for the two Governor's Opportunity Fund grants for Rolls-Royce, the company has announced further capital improvements of \$351.4 million and further jobs in Virginia of 472, resulting in a total capital investment of \$501.4 million and total jobs of 642. This project has been announced.
- 12. <u>Nottoway County</u>: **Showbest Fixture Corporation**, a manufacturer of store fixtures, will expand its existing facility in Nottoway County. Showbest will invest \$2.85 million and create 104 new jobs (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: building improvements). This project has been announced.
- 13. <u>Lunenburg County</u>: **Lignetics, Inc.**, a manufacturer of wood pellets for fuel, will locate a new facility in Lunenburg County. Lignetics will invest \$5.35 million and create 35 new jobs (amount of grant: \$75,000; use of grant: site improvements). This project has been announced.
