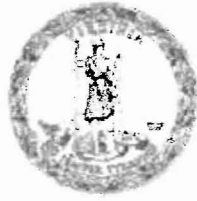

*March Data Footnotes*

**Inpatient Acute Care Facilities**

- 2 Acute care facilities reported they do not designate beds according to age.
- 20 facilities reported N/A
- 1 facility reflected the discrepancy related to the use of a swing bed on the adolescent unit
- 3 facilities indicated only staff for the number of residents in the building
- 1 facility indicated temporary closure of the children's residential unit (20 beds) effective March 1, 2009
- 1 facility cited no staff beds as the reason for the difference in licensed and staffed beds
- 1 facility noted no logical way to report age distinction
- 1 facility noted licensed for 28 as the reason for the difference
- 1 facility indicated 3 out of 31 were 18 years old as the reason for the difference in licensed and staffed beds
- 1 facility noted all residents were ages 10-17
- 1 facility noted 4.33 as their ADC for Jan-March

**Residential Treatment Facilities:**

- 4 facilities did not respond
  - 7 facilities reported N/A
  - 1 facility noted it was licensed for 28 as the reason for the difference
  - 1 facility reported it was closed for renovation
  - 3 facilities reported they only staff to the number of residents in the building
  - Residential facilities reported 828 fewer staffed than licensed beds
  - 7 of the 25 residential facilities reported data for youth under the age of 14
  - 7 facilities cited census as the reason for the difference in licensed and staffed beds
  - 1 facility reported 102 children and adolescents and noted they do not designate beds according to age
  - 1 facility reported it was licensed for 28 as the reason for the difference
  - 1 facility noted there is no logical way to report data
  - 1 facility reported 3 out of 31 were 18-19 year olds
  - 1 facility reported the use of a swing bed on the adolescent unit as the reason for the difference
- In the majority of situations these services serve children under age 14, but their beds are not licensed or staffed based on age 14 and the services could not categorize this data in that manner.
