Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to provide documentation of the transactions of the Governor's Opportunity Fund which have occurred during the first half of the 2009 fiscal year as required by § 2.2-115(F) of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>.

For the first half of the 2009 fiscal year, ended December 31, 2008, a total of \$8,465,000 was committed from the Opportunity Fund to assist ten projects relocating to or expanding in the state. A summary for each of these projects is enclosed. For the projects which have been announced, I am enclosing a profile, an analysis and recommendation by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, and a scoring sheet.

For the first half of the 2009 fiscal year, actual disbursements from the Fund were made to Botetourt County for Dynax; the Town of Christiansburg for Inorganic Ventures; Henry County for RTI; Page County for Shenandoah Waste Services; the City of Lynchburg for R.R. Donnelley; the City of Newport News for Canon; Culpeper County for Terremark; the City of Danville for Com.40; Page County for Premier Technical Services; Carroll County for AmeriPumps; Mecklenburg County for Electronic Data Systems; the City of Lynchburg for AREVA; Greensville County for Quality Culvert; Louisa County for C3RS; Giles County for Jennmar; and Botetourt County for Smorgon Steel. Actual disbursements totaled \$7,390,000.

## PROJECT SUMMARIES

- 1. <u>Carroll County</u>: **AmeriPumps, LLC** will locate a new facility in Carroll County. AmeriPumps is a manufacturer and distributor of commercial and industrial water pump systems and will create 125 new jobs. Investment will total \$4.6 million (amount of grant: \$150,000; use of grant: extension of water, sewer, and electrical to the site). This project has been announced.
- 2. <u>Louisa County</u>: **C3RS, Inc.**, a recycler of rubber tires, will locate a new facility in Louisa County. With an investment totaling \$4 million, this location will create 35 new jobs (amount of grant: \$65,000; use of grant: site development, onsite storm water control, utility extension, and paving). This project has been announced.
- 3. <u>Giles County</u>: **Jennmar**, a manufacturer of mining machinery and roof support systems, will expand its existing facility in Giles County. Investment will total \$2.7 million, with 50 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$100,000; use of grant: electrical upgrades). This project has been announced.
- 4. Project Not Yet Announced.
- 5. <u>Chesterfield County</u>: **Sabra Dipping Company, LLC** will locate a new facility in Chesterfield County. Sabra is a manufacturer of kosher vegetarian products and will create 260 new jobs. Investment will total \$59.3 million (amount of grant: \$350,000; use of grant: employee training and site preparation). This project has been announced.
- 6. <u>King George County</u>: **Harris Teeter Properties, LLC** will locate a new warehouse and distribution facility in King George County. With an investment totaling \$101 million, this location will create 335 new jobs (amount of grant: \$200,000; use of grant: site preparation). This project has been announced.
- 7. <u>City of Newport News</u>: **AREVA Newport News LLC**, a joint venture between AREVA NP and Northrop Grumman Shipbuilding, will locate a new facility in the City of Newport News. The company will manufacture pressure vessels and associated components for new nuclear energy facilities. Investment will total \$363.5 million, with 540 new jobs being created (amount of grant: \$3,000,000; use of grant: employee training and site development). This project has been announced.
- 8. Project Not Yet Announced.
- 9. <u>City of Newport News</u>: **Continental AG**, a supplier of automotive components, will expand its existing facility in the City of Newport News. This location will create 250 new jobs and invest \$159 million. A second phase creating an additional 68 jobs and \$35 million is also planned (amount of grant: \$3,000,000; use of grant: employee training). This project has been announced.

10. <u>Grayson County</u>: **Nautilus Inc.**, a manufacturer of branded health and fitness products, will expand its existing facility in Grayson County. With an investment totaling \$1.7 million, this expansion will create 60 new jobs (amount of grant: \$50,000; use of grant: employee training). This project has been announced.
