2010 Appropriations Act, Item 384, A.2.

The attached table shows grants awarded by the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) for fiscal year 2011 for which state general funds were required for matching purposes.

For each grant, the table provides the name of the recipient, the start and end dates of the grant, the amount of federal funds awarded, the amounts of the state and local (if any) matching funds, and a brief description of the project funded.

Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG)

The Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program provides federal funds to the states for their use in making grants to localities, state agencies and non-profit organizations. The funds may be used for projects to prevent and control crime, and improve the functioning of all elements of the criminal justice system. For fiscal year 2011 there were 36 new JAG grants funded and 56 JAG continuation grants funded.

The amount each state receives annually is determined by a crime and population formula. Virginia's most recent award of JAG funds, from the federal fiscal year 2010 appropriation, was \$5.9 million. DCJS typically awards more than half of each year's funds to local projects, exceeding requirements of the grant program. The grants shown include the required matching funds.

Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Program (JABG)

The Juvenile Accountability Block Grant provides federal funds to the states for their use in making grants intended to reduce juvenile offending through accountability-based programs that focus on offenders and the state and local juvenile justice system. For fiscal year 2011 there were no new JABG grants funded and 24 JABG continuation grants funded.

The amount each state receives annually is determined by a formula; Virginia's current allocation of JABG funds is \$1.05 million, 75% of which must be awarded to projects at the local level. The grants listed include the required cash matching funds, both state and local, equal to 10% of projects costs.
