Dear Chairmen:

Virginia Code § 16.1-69.10 provides that the Committee on District Courts shall make a study and report to the General Assembly on the number of district court judges needed and the districts for which they shall be authorized. As reported last fall, the Committee on District Courts found the need for four new general district judgeships (one each in the Second, Eleventh, Fifteenth and Twenty-sixth Judicial Districts), and six new juvenile and domestic relations district court judgeships (one each in the First, Eleventh, Fifteenth Sixteenth, Twenty-eighth and Twenty-ninth Judicial Districts). However, due to the economic difficulties faced by the Commonwealth, the Chief Justice did not seek authorization for these new judgeships during the 2009 Session of the General Assembly.

In light of the continuing economic crisis, the Chief Justice did not intend to seek authorization for any new judgeships during the 2010 Session of the General Assembly.
