Executive Summary

SJR 337 (Regular Session, 2009) requests that the Department of Planning and Budget (DPB) and the Virginia Liaison Office (VLO) advise state agencies of federal grant fund availability and provide training opportunities for staff and other technical assistance in applying for federal grants. DPB and the VLO have made and continue to make significant progress in advising state agencies of federal grant availability and providing training opportunities for staff and other technical assistance in applying for federal grants. In addition, DPB plans to explore way to improve efforts in 2010.

In writing this report, the term “grant” will refer to amounts of appropriated money that are administered by an agency in the executive branch. The government entity administering the grant sets requirements for distribution of the money, and there are also legislative requirements that must be followed. The government entity administering the grant usually releases a proposal to receive grant applications. Grants are evaluated to determine how closely they meet the specified requirements, and grant awards are made.

This report will specifically address federal grants, appropriated by Congress and administered by an agency of the federal government within the executive branch. This report will not address “earmarks.”

As of December 2009, DPB and the VLO have made the following progress:

Advise state agencies of federal grant fund availability

- The VLO distributes a weekly e-mail alert of federal grants. This e-mail alert was initiated on June 16, 2006. At the time of the writing of this report, the list was last updated December 23, 2009, and its Table of Contents is included in the appendix of this report (The full report is 527 pages). DPB plans to work with the VLO to make the list available online in FY2010.
- The VLO distributes a weekly e-mail alert of currently available American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grants that is also posted on the Virginia’s Stimulus web site. This e-mail alert was initiated on June 26, 2009. At the time of the writing of this report, the list was last updated December 23, 2009, and is included in the appendix of this report.
- DPB and the VLO participated in the development of Virginia’s Stimulus web site that produced more than 9,000 ARRA project proposals.

Provide training opportunities for staff and other technical assistance in applying for federal grants

Other efforts

- In FY2010, DPB plans to begin work on an information sharing system for federal grants that will involve the Capital Region Grant Collaboration Group.

I. Advise state agencies of federal grant fund availability

Federal Grant Alerts

The VLO has distributed a list of available federal grants through weekly e-mail alerts since June 16, 2006. To create the list, VLO staff download grant information from the Grants.Gov web site that is applicable to the Commonwealth. As the deadlines for grants arrive, the affected grant alert is taken off the upcoming e-mail alerts. The process takes about four to five hours per week.

The original distribution list included the Governor's Cabinet Secretaries and Deputy Secretaries. As popularity of the list has grown, state agency representatives have contacted the VLO to be added to the distribution list. At the time of the writing of this report, the list was last updated December 23, 2009, and was distributed to 141 people across 52 agencies and universities (almost all of the distribution list includes state agencies or universities with the exception of three). The Federal Grant Alert process, developed by the VLO, has been replicated by other state liaison offices, including Massachusetts.

The December 23, 2009, federal grant alert update was 527 pages in length, included 968 grants from 26 federal agencies (5 agencies reported no grants). The Table of Contents from the latest update is included as Appendix I of this report.

In FY2010, DPB plans to begin work with the VLO to make the list available online so that state agency grant writers can more easily access the information.

American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Competitive Grant Alerts

The VLO has distributed a list of currently available ARRA grants through e-mail one to two times per week since June 26, 2009. It was originally sent to every Cabinet Secretary, Deputy Secretary, and the Policy Office.

At the time of the writing of this report, the ARRA grants list was last updated December 23, 2009, and was distributed to 63 people across 25 agencies and universities. The majority (but not all of the recipients) are with state agencies. As the deadlines for grants arrive, the affected grant alert is taken off the upcoming e-mail alerts.

The latest ARRA grant list included 54 grants from 8 federal agencies (24 agencies reported no grants).

1) December 2009: Section 1512 Webinars Rescheduled

2) December 2009: FTA Issues Reminder of March 5, 2010 Obligation Deadline

The March 5, 2010, deadline for obligating 100% of ARRA formula funds is approaching. All new grants and grant amendment applications for ARRA formula funds must be submitted to FTA by December 27, 2009, in order to ensure that FTA will be able to process the applications in time for the deadline. Virginia Stimulus Web Site

In anticipation of the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, DPB and other state agency participants developed a web site to collect requests from the public for allocation of stimulus funds and to provide a centralized location for projects that could be supported from federal stimulus funds. The web site was published February 10, 2009, and the Commonwealth stopped accepting proposals for projects on March 6, 2009.

The web site produced more than 9,000 project proposal requests from citizens, localities, and other groups.

The Governor's Stimulus Working Group (DPB and the VLO were part of the group) sent these project proposals to the Governor's Cabinet Secretaries for review and evaluation. The VLO Executive Director was tasked with monitoring relevant federal requirements and guidelines as issued.

According to the Stimulus web site, Stimulus funds could be used to help:

- Modernize the state's infrastructure
- Enhance our energy independence
- Expand educational opportunities
- Increase access to health care

- Provide tax relief and protect those in greatest need
- Assist those most affected by the recession

The Stimulus web site is now used to inform the public on how the Stimulus money is being used and its impact on the Commonwealth.

II. Provide training opportunities for staff and other technical assistance in applying for federal grants

Society of Research Administrator's (SRA) International Conference about Grants: October 2008

The Executive Director of the VLO spoke at this conference. His session focused on “Working in the Global Community Leveraging Grant Opportunities: A State Perspective.” It addressed the following learning objectives:

- Learn about the grants process at the state level
- Learn how to creatively leverage grant dollars to enhance programs
- Learn how the state and local economy can benefit from international collaborations

Tri-State Grant Seminar: June 2007

The VLO sponsored the Tri-State Grant Seminar, along with Maryland and the District of Columbia, which provided new and unique grant opportunities for Virginia businesses. Over 100 people attended the tri-state grant seminar, including at least 30 representatives from Virginia’s business community. The event focused on how businesses could partner with USTDA and the Ex-Im Bank to take advantage of international trade opportunities.

III. Other efforts

DPB plans to begin work on an interactive information sharing system for federal grants that will involve the Capital Region Grant Collaboration Group (CRGCG). The CRGCG is a group of grant professionals that work to improve collaboration on specific grant opportunities and discuss available grant opportunities. The goal of the information sharing system is to improve the effectiveness of grant applications in Virginia by connecting grant writers to each other, sharing information, and centralizing grant information.
