## **Chapter 890, Item 384, A2**

The attached table shows grants awarded by the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) for fiscal year 2012 for which general funds were required for matching purposes. All of the grants shown are either new grant awards or to continue projects that had previously received grant funding from DCJS.

For each grant, the table provides the name of the recipient, the start and end dates of the grant, the amount of federal funds awarded, the amounts of state and local matching funds, and a brief description of the project funded.

### **Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program**

The Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program provides federal funds to the states for their use in making grants to localities, state agencies and nonprofit organizations. The funds may be used for projects to prevent and control crime, and improve the functioning of all elements of the criminal justice system.

The amount each state receives annually is determined by a crime rate and population formula. Virginia's most recent award of JAG funds, from the federal fiscal year 2011 (FFY2011) was \$4.8M. DCJS typically awards more than half of each year's funds to local projects, exceeding the required 35% 'pass through' amount.

### **Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Program**

The Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Program provides federal funds to the states for their use in making grants intended to reduce juvenile offending through accountability-based programs that focus on offenders and the state and local juvenile justice system.

The amount each state receives annually is determined by a formula; Virginia's current allocation of JABG is \$827K, 75% of which must be awarded to projects at the local level. The grants listed include the required cash matching funds, both state and local, equal to 10% of the projected costs.

### **Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Title V**

The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Title V (JJDP Title V) incentive grant program supports units of general local government which have formulated a comprehensive, community-wide strategy for addressing the prevention of delinquency. This prevention strategy is based on the assessment of risk factors which research has shown to be associated with the development of delinquent behavior. The applicant must provide a match of at least 50% of the grant award. The most recent federal award to Virginia was \$50K.

### **Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program**

The Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program provides funding for residential treatment services to adult offenders incarcerated in local jails and state prisons as well as juveniles in juvenile correctional centers and detention centers. Each states annual award of these federal funds is determined by a formula. The general fund match requirement is 25% of the federal grant award. For FFY2011 Virginia was awarded \$575 in RSAT funding.
