SUBJECT: Report on the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund

Pursuant to Section 33.1-221.1:8 of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>, the Governor is required to submit semiannual reports on the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund ("TPOF" or the "Fund"). This memorandum and related Attachment will constitute that report on behalf of Governor McDonnell for the period ending June 30, 2012.

To date, capitalization for the Fund has come from the following:

- \$23,600,000 and \$26,400,000 from the Toll Facility Revolving Account and from the Highway Construction Fund, respectively, pursuant to Chapter 847 of the Acts of Assembly of 2005;
- \$305,000,000 pursuant to Chapter 896 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007; and,
- \$50,000,000 made available July 1, 2011 from the Commonwealth Transportation Fund pursuant to Item 452 H. of Chapter 890 of the Acts of Assembly of 2011.

The \$305,000,000, as outlined by Chapter 896 of the 2007 Acts of Assembly, is targeted for specific projects while the other \$100,000,000 may be used for any eligible applicant and project. The body of this report focuses on the use of the \$100,000,000. The Attachment to the report provides a brief summary and overview on the use of the \$305,000,000 to date.

For the period ending December 31, 2011, the twelfth semiannual report was submitted outlining the activities of the Fund. At that time, twenty-four applications, representing nineteen separate projects, had been submitted requesting a total of \$155,602,500 in assistance, with \$68,411,912 in awards approved by the Governor

During this reporting period of January 1, 2012 to June 30, 2012, the TPOF program experienced the following activity:

- In late September 2011, the TPOF Advisory Panel (the "Panel") considered the County of Rockingham's second application, dated June 7, 2011, requesting a \$5,000,000 grant for the Southeast Connector project. The Panel recommended an award of the \$5,000,000 grant, conditioned upon the successful completion of various fund transfers to complete the funding package for the project. In April 2012, the Virginia Department of Transportation ("VDOT or the "Department") completed action on the transfers with support from the locality. In May 2012, the Panel concurred with the award documents going forward to the Governor; and on June 5, 2012, the Governor executed the decision brief. A grant agreement is currently being negotiated and is expected to be in place August 1, 2012.
- The County of Prince William submitted two applications, both dated February 7, 2012, requesting a total of \$4,978,062 in grant assistance to be used for transportation improvements associated with the United States Marine Corps Heritage Center. One application requested a \$2,242,350 grant to finance enhancements to U.S. Route 1 and other improvements at the intersection with the new, southern access point at Heritage Center Parkway. The second application requested a \$2,735,712 grant to fund an extension to Heritage Center Parkway and create the southern access point. The Panel considered the applications, recommended approval of the requests and the Governor awarded the two grants on June 5, 2012. A grant agreement between is currently being negotiated and is expected to be in place August 15, 2012.
- A grant agreement, dated March 1, 2012, was entered into between the Department and the City of Winchester for the \$4,984,500 grant awarded December 20, 2011 by the Governor for the transportation improvements associated with the expansion of the Rubbermaid Commercial Products' existing operation.

With the close of this reporting period, twenty-six applications, representing twenty-one separate projects, have been submitted requesting a total of \$160,580,912 in TPOF assistance, with \$78,389,974 in awards approved by the Governor.

Please review the attached details. The Fund continues to be one of many tools available to market the Commonwealth to prospective economic development clients, to assist in developing

important public-private partnerships and to advance much needed Design-Build procured transportation improvements. For TPOF to remain a viable source of financial assistance for these types of projects, a sustainable source of funding for TPOF's continuing capitalization is a critical need.

Report on the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund Chapter 896 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007 Item 449.10 - \$305,000,000 Appropriation

Through Item 449.10 of Chapter 847 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007, \$305,000,000 was allotted to TPOF out of the \$500,000,000 for the 2007 Transportation Initiative (the "Initiative") projects.

In 2008, the General Assembly, through Item 462 of Chapter 879 of the Acts of Assembly of 2008, reappropriated \$180,000,000 of the \$500,000,000 back to the Commonwealth of Virginia's General Fund. To substitute for these monies, Item 459.H. of Chapter 879 of the Acts of Assembly of 2008 authorized the issuance of \$180,000,000 of Capital Project Revenue bonds.

During this reporting period, there was no activity with the Initiative projects.
