The defendant is awaiting sentencing.

In addition, I report that, in 2011, an application for an intercept of communications to and from a wireless telephone and an application for an extension of that intercept were made to a circuit court judge. The court granted each application, which were part of a single investigation and involved one cellular telephone number. At this time, one arrest has been made, but no trial has been held. The cost associated with the intercept was \$104,221.
