Dear Governor McDonnell and Chairmen Stosch and Putney:

Virginia Code § 19.2-163 requires the Executive Secretary to report to the Governor, members of the House Appropriations Committee and members of the Senate Finance Committee, on a quarterly basis, "the number and category of offenses charged involving adult and juvenile offenders in cases in which court-appointed counsel is assigned" and "the amounts paid by waiver above the initial cap to court-appointed counsel."

During the first three quarters of fiscal year 2013, 6,319 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$ 2,945,066, and 5,873 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$ 2,599,337 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap.
