RE: Virginia Code § 19.2-70

Dear Ms. Schaar and Mr. Nardo:

I write pursuant to Virginia Code § 19.2-70 to report that no applications requesting authorization to intercept oral or electronic communications were submitted in 2013. I also write to provide a supplemental report on intercept activity in 1995 and 2012. In supplementing the letter of December 18, 1995, I report that an arrest was made in 2013 related to the intercept activity by the Commonwealth authorized by the Clarke County Circuit Court in 1995.

In supplementing my letter of December 19, 2012, I report that, as a result of the intercept activity in 2012, the Commonwealth has arrested nineteen individuals on narcotics-related charges. In addition, the intercept activity in 2012 resulted in another individual having one year of a suspended sentence from a previous conviction being imposed by the Henrico County Circuit Court. In 2013, the Commonwealth obtained narcotics-related convictions against ten defendants in the Henrico County Circuit Court. Specifically, the Commonwealth obtained three convictions for conspiracy to distribute cocaine; seven convictions for conspiracy to distribute marijuana; two convictions for distribution of cocaine; one conviction for possession with the intent to distribute cocaine; and one conviction for possession of a firearm while distributing a Schedule II drug. Additional trials are pending.

I will supplement this report to provide information about any additional convictions or arrests.
