Dear Messrs, Chairmen:

I am writing to update you on the recent activities with respect to the Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund (AFID) during the preceding six-month period as required by § 3.2-309 of the Code of Virginia.

The General Assembly created the AFID program at my request during the 2012 session, funding it at \$2 million over the biennium. Immediately upon its passage, the Secretariat of Agriculture and Forestry and staff from the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) began to develop draft program guidelines and procedures for administering this new program. The development of these guidelines and procedures was based on the legislation and informed by meetings with industry stakeholders, legislators and Senate Finance and House Appropriations committee staff

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that the secretariat held in late 2011 and early 2012 to gather ideas on how to promote economic development within the agriculture and forestry sectors. Stakeholders included the Virginia Farm Bureau, Virginia Agribusiness Council, Virginia Forest Products Association, Virginia Forestry Association, individual industry participants, local economic development officials, the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Municipal League.

Over the course of the summer, the secretariat held two additional meetings with the stakeholder group to review the proposed program documents and receive comment. The revised documents were also shared with staff at the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, who provided valuable feedback in terms of program implementation and guideline development. AFID program guidelines and application materials were released in their final form on August 23, 2012. Since that time, the secretariat and VDACS have received a tremendous number of inquiries and expressions of enthusiasm about the program from localities and private sector interests. The first AFID grant award announcement was made on December 17, 2012, and involved Homestead Creamery in Franklin County. Additional projects are in various stages of consideration by the program with the opportunity for multiple announcements to be made during the next six months, depending on economic conditions and project specifications.

As part of the budget language funding the AFID program, \$250,000 in each year of the biennium was set-aside to encourage localities to think strategically about how they can better support and integrate agriculture and forestry-based industries into their community's overall economic development efforts. The AFID Planning Grants Program was developed with input from industry stakeholders including the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development. The first round of applications for this new program is due March 1, 2013, with the first planning grants to be awarded in April 2013. The program guidelines are enclosed, with details on the awards made under this program to be included in the next semiannual report.

For the second half of calendar year 2012, a total of \$60,000 was committed from AFID to assist one project expanding in the state. A summary of this project is listed below:
