During the first two quarters of fiscal year 2014, 4,960 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$ 2,365,968, and 4,692 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$ 2,117,393 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap.
