Dear Ms. Schaar and Mr. Nardo:

I write pursuant to Virginia Code § 19.2-70 to report that no applications requesting authorization to intercept oral, wire, or electronic communications were submitted in 2014. I also write to provide a supplemental report on intercept activity in 1995 and 2012. In supplementing the letter of December 18, 1995, I report that a conviction for murder in the first degree was obtained in 2014 in the Fauquier County Circuit Court related to the intercept activity authorized by the Clarke County Circuit Court in 1995.

In supplementing my letters of December 19, 2012, and December 17, 2013, I report that, as a result of the intercept activity in 2012, the Commonwealth has arrested a total of twenty-one individuals on narcotics-related charges and has obtained a total of nineteen convictions. In 2014, specifically, in the Henrico County Circuit Court, the Commonwealth obtained three convictions for conspiracy to distribute cocaine; three convictions for conspiracy to distribute marijuana; and one conviction for conspiracy to transport cocaine into the Commonwealth. In the City of Richmond Circuit Court, the Commonwealth obtained one conviction for distribution of marijuana and one conviction for distribution of cocaine. Two additional trials are pending.
