Dear Chairmen:

Virginia Code § 17.1-507 provides that the Judicial Council shall make a study and report to the Courts of Justice Committees of the House of Delegates and Senate on the number of new circuit court judgeships needed and the circuits for which they should be authorized.

As you are aware, Chapter 601, Virginia Acts of Assembly (2012), directed the Supreme Court of Virginia to "develop and implement a weighted caseload system to precisely measure and compare judicial caseloads throughout the Commonwealth on the circuit court, general district court, and juvenile and domestic relations district court levels." In response to the legislation, the Supreme Court of Virginia's Office of the Executive Secretary contracted with the National Center for State Courts (NCSC) to develop a weighted caseload system for Virginia's trial courts. In light of the detailed study conducted by the National Center for State Courts, the Judicial Council did not conduct a study regarding the need for new circuit court judgeships this year. On December 2, The Executive Committee of the Judicial Council adopted the National Center for State Courts' report and recommendations.

In the Virginia Judicial Workload Assessment Report, the National Center for State Courts recommended that the General Assembly consider filling judicial vacancies and, in some cases, creating new judicial positions, in circuits where the weighted caseload model shows a need for additional judicial resources. Based on the Virginia Judicial Workload Assessment Report, the Judicial Council recommends the authorization of 20 new circuit court judgeships (one each in the Sixth, Seventh, Tenth, Twelfth, Sixteenth, Eighteenth, Twenty-second, Twenty-fifth, Twenty-eighth, Twenty-ninth, Thirtieth, and Thirty-first Judicial Circuits; two each in the Fifteenth and Twentyseventh Judicial Circuits; and three additional judgeships in the Twenty-sixth Judicial Circuit). Additionally, the weighted caseload study reveals that seven judgeships currently authorized are not supported by the caseload in the circuits for which they are authorized (one each in the Second, Third, Fourth, Eighth, Seventeenth, Twenty-first, and Twenty-third Judicial Circuits). Six of these authorized judgeships (in the Second, Third, Fourth, Eighth, Seventeenth, and Twenty-third Judicial Circuits) can be reallocated if a current/announced judicial vacancy is left unfilled in each of these circuits.
