Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to update you on the recent activities with respect to the Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund (AFID) program during the preceding six-month period as required by § 3.2-309 of the Code of Virginia.

The General Assembly created the AFID program during the 2012 legislative session, funding it at \$2 million over the biennium. Upon its passage, the Secretariat of Agriculture and Forestry and staff from the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) developed guidelines and procedures for administering this new program. These guidelines and procedures were released on August 23, 2012.

Through December 30, 2013, eight AFID Facility Grants have been awarded to localities supporting a variety of agriculture and forestry based economic development projects. Six of those localities have entered into the required Performance Agreements and requested disbursements from the fund.

The secretariat and VDACS continue to receive a tremendous number of inquiries and expressions of interest in the program. In addition to the eight awarded projects, several others are in various stages of consideration by the secretariat, with the opportunity for multiple announcements to be made during the next six months. VDACS is also in the process of developing the annual reporting requirements for each Facility Grant project, and will include these reporting requirements in the sixmonth report submitted in July 2014.

During the second half of calendar year 2013, a total of \$400,000 was committed from AFID to assist three new and expanding projects in the state. Summaries of these projects are listed below:

## AFID Facility Grant Total Economic Development Impact

As of December 2013, a total of eight announced AFID Facility Grant projects totaling \$835,000 in grant funds were committed or expended. These eight projects account for the creation of 910 new jobs and \$99.19 million in new capital investments.

### **AFID Planning Grants Program**

As part of the budget language funding the AFID program, \$250,000 in each year of the biennium was appropriated to encourage localities to think strategically about how they can better support and integrate agriculture and forestry-based industries into their community's overall economic development efforts. The AFID Planning Grants Program was developed with input from industry stakeholders, as well as the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development. The first round of applications for this new program was due March 1, 2013, with the first planning grants awarded in May 2013. AFID Planning Grants in the amount of \$249,000 were awarded to 11 projects covering 31 localities.

A second round of AFID Planning Grant funding was announced July 10, 2013, with \$60,500 awarded on October 16, 2013, to three projects covering seven localities developing plans on agritourism, a Virginia wine heritage center, and local food systems. Here is a summary of each project:

Project Title:	Feasibility Study to Establish Virginia Wine Heritage Center in Albemarle
	County
Applicant:	Albemarle County

Summary: Albemarle County is partnering with the Charlottesville/Albemarle Convention and Visitors Bureau, Thomas Jefferson Foundation/Monticello, and Piedmont Virginia Community College, to bring in an expert consultant to examine the feasibility of establishing a Virginia Wine Heritage Center in Albemarle County. The study will look at critical partnerships, facility attributes and location, funding needs, and the appropriate business model.

Project Title:	Building Agricultural and Forestry-based Businesses in The Foothills
Applicant:	Rappahannock-Rapidan Region-Planning District (RRPDC); includes Culpepper,
	Orange, Madison, Fauquier, and Rappahannock Counties

Summary: The project is an effort to increase support and preservation of the region's agricultural and forestry-based industries by implementing specific strategies designed to raise awareness of these industries, increase the purchases of regional agriculture and forestry products, and sustain the future of agriculture and forestry in the region. Deliverables include a regional agro-artisan trail, directory, brand, annual conference, and marketing effort; and

completion of regional green infrastructure maps and data, including agricultural soils and water quality.

 Linking the Virginia Tech Catawba Sustainability Center to the Local Food System

Summary: The Virginia Tech Catawba Sustainability Center is a 377-acre historic dairy farm located in Roanoke County that was donated by the former Catawba Sanitarium to Virginia Tech. In recent years, Roanoke County has helped fund the activities of the center and searched for ways to help the center contribute to the region's economy. Roanoke County and staff at the center will work with Virginia Tech's Office of Economic Development to explore strategies to increase the connectivity of the Catawba Sustainability Center to the regional food system.

For the remainder of fiscal year 2014, requests for AFID Planning Grants funding, which has almost \$215,000 in uncommitted funds (including approximately \$25,000 in returned funds), will be accepted, reviewed, and awarded on a rolling basis until the fund is exhausted. Approximately \$34,000 in AFID Planning Grant applications are currently under review, with an announcement expected by the end of January 2014. Several additional projects are also under development, and will be announce later this year.
