#### REPORT ON THE ACTUAL EXPENDITURES AND PERFORMANCE RESULTS ACHIEVED BY THE SOUTHERN VIRGINIA INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN TASK FORCE DURING THE 2015 YEAR

#### OVERVIEW OF THE TASK FORCE

The Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, otherwise known as SOVA-ICAC, was founded in 1998 with funding from the Department of Justice through the Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention. Originally, the task force name was Operation Blue Ridge Thunder. The task force designation is through the Bedford County Sheriff's Office. Initial investigative responsibilities were investigating child sexual exploitation crimes perpetrated against children through the use of the Internet but was later changed to include most all child sexual exploitation crimes perpetrated against children to include, but not limited to, child trafficking and child prostitution.

The SOVA-ICAC is headed by the Bedford County Sheriff's Office, and has 129 affiliate member agencies from all areas of Law Enforcement, the private sector and Non-Government Organizations. Law Enforcement support comes from Federal, State, County City/Local, Tribal and Military agencies.

#### **PERSONNEL**

Funding in the Personnel category was allocated to pay salaries and benefits of core SOVA-ICAC personnel. Core SOVA-ICAC personnel operate out of the SOVA-ICAC office in Forest, Virginia, located within the confines of Bedford County, Virginia. ICAC personnel are employed by the Bedford County Sheriff's Office. The staff is comprised of a Task Force Commander, Analyst, Cyber Tip Manager and twelve Investigators, assigned to criminal investigations and forensic analysis. The investigative team is composed of two working Sergeants, and five Investigators. A sixth Investigator is employed by the Franklin County Sheriff's Office, and is embedded full-time out of the Forest, VA Task Force Office. There is also one Sergeant and three Investigators assigned to the Forensic Evidence Analysis Unit. Over the last twelve months there was a significant amount of time when positions could not be filled due to manpower issues. The costs savings in the personnel category allowed for an adjustment of funding to the equipment category and supplies category.

#### **EQUIPMENT**

Funding in the equipment category is used to purchase equipment used solely by ICAC personnel to investigate child sexual exploitation cases, and on prevention and education efforts within the community, focusing on child sexual exploitation. Equipment includes the following:

- Computer systems for processing evidence
- Miscellaneous software
- Server rack
- Two upgraded computer server systems
- Computer Hardware for Forensics Lab
- Computer Software for Forensics Lab
- Computers for Investigators
- Forensic bridge kits

#### **SUPPLIES and OTHER EXPENSES**

Monthly recurring costs such as electric service, gas service, cellular phone contracts, copier and postage costs, alarm and building services and Internet communications services were expended from the Supplies and Other Expenses category.

#### **PERSONNEL**

Funds were allocated to reimburse for time worked by SOVA-ICAC affiliates. The 129 law enforcement, prosecution, and victim offices affiliated with SOVA-ICAC employ these staff members, and the funds reimburse them for work performed for ICAC investigations.

Funding in the travel category is used to train and educate the members of our 129 affiliates and equip them to continue their investigations to locate those individuals who prey upon and exploit our children and secure the evidence needed to bring them to trial. ## <u>Cases of interest during the reporting period of July 2014 – June 2015 include the following:</u>

#### **BEDFORD** Bedford, Va (News and Advance) March 9, 2015

Jury finds Navy pilot guilty of sex charges against Bedford, Roanoke victims - A federal jury on Monday found a Virginia Beach Navy pilot guilty of distributing child pornography and other online sex charges involving nine underage victims, including one girl from Bedford County and two girls from Roanoke County.

Daniel Chase Harris, 31, was convicted in U.S. District Court in Norfolk following a 12-day trial. The Bedford County Sheriff's Office arrested Harris in November 2013 after an investigation into his online activities; the case later was moved to federal court.

Harris, a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy and a Top Gun instructor stationed at Naval Air Station Oceana, posed online as a teenage boy and would convince girls ages 12 to 17 to send him explicit photos of themselves, according to prosecutors' evidence. He then extorted the girls to send him additional sexually graphic photos and threatened them with posting the images online or sending the images to family and friends, a news release issued Monday from the U.S. Attorney's Office in the Eastern District of Virginia said.

In all, Harris was convicted on 31 counts, including production of child pornography, use of a facility of interstate commerce to entice a minor to engage in criminal sexual activity, obstruction of justice and receiving, possessing and transporting child pornography.

The other victims in the case were from outside Virginia. Homeland Security Investigations and the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force in Bedford led the investigation.

Bedford County Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Wes Nance spent the better part of the three weeks assisting in prosecuting Harris and called Monday's verdict "immensely satisfying."

Nance called it a team effort and a "great day of justice for those girls," eight of whom testified during the trial, including the Bedford County victim. He added Assistant U.S.

Attorney Elizabeth Yusi, who also prosecuted the case, was a great person to "go to war with."

There were many "logistical challenges" in bringing the case forward, he said, and the weather caused court to be canceled for two days. Harris testified for nearly two days in his defense, Nance said, and the prosecutor's cross-examination lasted several hours.

In intensity and length, Nance said the only similar experience he had in Bedford County was prosecuting Wesley Earnest, a former educator convicted of murder in April 2010 and again in November 2010 after a mistrial. Earnest is serving life in prison for killing his wife, Jocelyn.

Nance said Harris' conviction shows the importance of the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children task force in its mission to protect youth from sexual predators.

"And it's a battle they are winning," Nance said.

Harris "lured" young girls through the Internet and made them think he was a real person they had met or should know, Nance said.

"It's also a call for parents to make sure they know what their kids are doing online," Nance said.

Harris was sentenced to 50 years active prison sentence.

#### CHESTERFIELD - Chesterfield, Va WWBT NBC12 April 2, 2015

Walter Blanco-Maldonado is facing serious charges after police say they executed a search warrant at his home in the Amber Leaves Apartments – just off Walmsley Boulevard. Investigators say they found child porn items on a computer and made the arrest Thursday morning. Blanco-Maldonado is facing several child porn possession charges. Court records show he's due in court next month.

#### BEDFORD COUNTY - Bedford, Va April 13, 2015

On April 17, 2015, Cameron Boyd, of Forest, VA, was arrested on charges related to the possession of child pornography.

In 2013 Cameron Boyd became a person of interest to the SOVA-ICAC when a Detective from Lynchburg Police Department downloaded child pornography from a suspect

believed to be within the city of Lynchburg. Further investigation led to the discovery that the suspect lived in Bedford County, at which point the case was referred to the Bedford Sheriff's Office.

In 2014, investigators from the Bedford County Sheriff's Offices assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force unit, executed a search warrant at the residence of Boyd, 27, of Forest, Virginia, seeking evidence related to the internet activity involving the possession of child pornography. Numerous pieces of evidence were collected, including laptop computers, and digital storage media, which were submitted for forensic analysis. Upon completion of the analysis, the case was presented to the Commonwealth's Attorney Office for review, and Boyd was subsequently indicted by a grand jury on April 3, 2015.

Lynchburg Police Department is an affiliate agency with the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, which has been administered by the Bedford Sheriff's Office since the task force program was created in 1998.
