Dear Governor McAuliffe:

Section 23-9.14:1 of the Code of Virginia states that the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia "shall develop, in consultation with public institutions of higher education and members of their governing boards, and annually deliver educational programs for the governing boards of such institutions" and "submit an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Council pursuant to this section no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly."

In accordance with this requirement, SCHEV staff held a mandatory orientation session for newly appointed board members on October 21-22, 2014. A copy of the agenda summarizing the topics covered in these meetings is included as attachment 1.

In order to comply with the mandate to develop the orientation "in consultation with public institutions of higher education and members of their governing boards," SCHEV created a planning committee that included two college presidents, two Council members, one rector, and three college representatives. Representatives from the Secretary of Education, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and the Office of the Attorney General also participated in the planning sessions.

There were a total of 66 new BOV appointments by the Governor in 2014. A total of 57 new members attended the orientation in October. The new members who were unable to attend the 2014 orientation understand that they will be required to attend the 2015 orientation session.

Following the orientation session, SCHEV staff asked attendees to complete an evaluation survey. Results of the survey indicate that of the 27 new members that responded, all of them rated the program as valuable in providing good examples of best practices for board governance. The 27 respondents also rated the program as valuable in providing useful information regarding national and state issues in higher education.
