Please find enclosed the Department of Planning and Budget's (DPB) official forecasts of expenditures for Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), mandatory child day care, foster care maintenance and adoption subsidy programs for fiscal years 2016 through 2018.

Please note that the forecast includes an adjustment for the 2.5 percent increase in TANF payments set to go into effect on January 1, 2016, based on the estimates used in the amendment contained in Chapter 665, 2015 Acts of the Assembly. Since this increase is prospective, actual impacts may therefore vary with utilization variances.
