Dear Messrs. Chairmen:

I am writing to update you on the recent activities with respect to the Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund (AFID) during the preceding six-month period as required by § 3.2-309 of the Code of Virginia.

The General Assembly created the AFID incentive program during the 2012 legislative session, funding it at \$1 million per year beginning in FY2013, with \$750,000 of each year's amount dedicated to AFID Facility Grants and \$250,000 to AFID Planning Grants.

AFID Facility Grant Program

Through December 31, 2014, 18 AFID Facility Grants have been awarded in 16 localities supporting a variety of agriculture and forestry based economic development projects. Fourteen of those localities have entered into the required Performance Agreements and requested disbursements from the fund, while progress is being made in developing the Performance Agreements for the most recent awards. The Secretary of Agriculture and Forestry and the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) continue to receive a tremendous number of inquiries and expressions of interest in the program, with multiple projects in various stages of consideration by the secretariat with the opportunity for numerous announcements to be made during the next six months.

During the second half of calendar year 2014, a total of \$490,000 was committed in AFID Facility Grant funds to assist five new and expanding projects in the Commonwealth. Summaries of these projects are listed below:

AFID Facility Grant Total Economic Development Impact

As of December 31, 2014, there have been a total of 18 announced AFID Facility Grant projects totaling \$1,789,700 in grant funds committed or expended. These 18 projects account for 1,266 new jobs created and \$145,310,000 in new capital investments. These agribusiness companies have, on

average, committed to purchase from Virginia approximately 72% of all the additional agricultural and forest products they will use to meet their new value-added processing needs.

AFID Planning Grant Program

As part of the budget language funding the AFID program, \$250,000 in each year was set-aside to encourage localities to think strategically about how they can better support and integrate agriculture and forestry-based industries into their community's overall economic development efforts. The AFID Planning Grants Program was developed with input from industry stakeholders, as well as the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development.

AFID Planning Grant applications are accepted on a rolling basis, allowing for applicants to work with the AFID Fund Coordinator to refine their project and submit stronger applications. During the second half of the calendar year 2014, Governor McAuliffe announced four AFID Planning Grant awards totaling \$61,190, covering five localities. Below is a summary of each project:

Project Title: Fauquier County Cost of Community Services Study

Applicant: Fauquier County

Amount Requested: \$6,190

Summary: Fauquier County sought funding to complete a cost of community services

study to obtain a better understanding of the fiscal impacts of various land use categories. This study, like a similar one before it for Fauquier, will be completed by UVA's Weldon-Cooper Center. The study will document, among other things, the fiscal impact working agricultural lands offer the County. The County Agricultural Committee will oversee

the project.

Project Title: Feasibility of Alternative Energy Production Options using Local

Summary: Buckingham County sought funding to have an outside consultant conduct

a feasibility analysis and planning proposal for alternative energy options for public buildings using local agriculture and forestry feedstocks in the County. The study will include an economic feasibility analysis of local

government and school buildings for conversion to biomass heating systems, feedstock availability, and a review of policies and ordinances that might assist or impede possible conversion. This effort will develop a template for other communities to follow for evaluating possible

conversion of their public buildings to biomass heat.

Amount Requested: \$35,000

Summary: The Buckingham Cattlemen's Association, representing 235 producers

over 20 counties in Central Virginia, sought funding to partner with local governments, VDACS and the Tobacco Commission to construct a large new multi-use facility and outside sales arena that will allow for on-site sale of cattle and hay that will offer them substantial cost savings, as well as provide a viable venue for other activities to benefit the broader

community. Grant funds will be used for the completion of interior finishes, including the installation of over \$18,000 worth of kitchen

equipment donated by Buckingham County Schools.

Project Title: Charles City County Agriculture and Forestry Economic

Development Plan

Applicant: Charles City County

Amount Requested: \$10,000

Summary: Charles City County recently contracted a consulting firm to conduct a

Economic Development Strategic Plan for the County. After learning of the AFID Planning Grant, the County decided to seek funding to add a robust agriculture and forestry component to this plan. Specific issues to be addressed include: improving land-use and zoning policies, developing eco- and agri-tourism, timber industry expansion, and supporting a new wine industry. The County is pledging an additional \$5,000 in local funds

and \$5,000 of staff time toward this project.

Since the inception of the AFID Planning Grant, \$465,190 in awards has been announced, funding 22 projects in 48 localities. Multiple projects are in various stages of consideration by the secretariat with the opportunity for numerous announcements to be made during the next year.
