SUBJECT: Report on the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund

Pursuant to Section §33.2-1529.1 of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>, the Governor is required to submit semiannual reports on the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund ("TPOF" or the "Fund"). This memorandum and the related attachment will constitute that report on behalf of Governor McAuliffe for the period ending June 30, 2016.

To date, capitalization for the Fund has come from the following:

- \$23,600,000 and \$26,400,000 from the Toll Facility Revolving Account and from the Highway Construction Fund, respectively, pursuant to Chapter 951 of the Acts of Assembly of 2005;
- \$305,000,000 pursuant to Chapter 847 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007 and Chapter 780 of the Acts of Assembly of 2016;
- \$50,000,000 made available July 1, 2011 from the Commonwealth Transportation Fund pursuant to Item 452 H. of Chapter 890 of the Acts of Assembly of 2011.
- House Bill 1887, effective July 1, 2015 provides the TPOF with one-third of all interest, dividends, and appreciation that may accrue to the Transportation Trust Fund and the Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund.

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The \$305,000,000, as outlined by Chapter 847 of the 2007 Acts of Assembly and Chapter 780 of the 2016 Acts of Assembly, is targeted for specific projects while the remaining \$100,000,000 may be used for any eligible applicant and project. The body of this report focuses on the use of the \$100,000,000 while the attachment provides a brief summary and overview of the fund in its entirety as of June 30, 2016.

At the end of the previous reporting period, ending December 31, 2015, thirty-five applications, representing twenty-six separate projects, had been submitted requesting a total of \$190,728,000 in assistance, with \$103,862,233 in awards approved by the Governor and reductions of \$11,937,719 pending the Governor's approval.

During this reporting period of January 1 to June 30, 2016, the TPOF program experienced the following activity or has pending activity from previous periods:

The Virginia Department of Transportation was awarded two grants of \$5 million each in 2011 for the CFX/Route 460 Interchange of the Coalfields Expressway project. The private partner, Bizzack Construction, LLC sent a letter to the Department stating that the TPOF funds were no longer needed because the project is eligible for 100% federal funding. They requested the money be transfer to another section of the overall project. The Advisory Panel met on March 30, 2015 to consider the request. Given that there is a lack of funding for the construction of the section, the Advisory Panel took actions to deny the transfer request and rescind the grants. The rescission is pending the Governor's approval. The original award amounts would be returned to the Fund.

The City of Winchester submitted a revised project and budget for the grant the City was awarded in December 2011. The City was unable to continue with the original scope of work due to condemnation issues. The grant amount was revised from \$4,984,500 to \$2,999,248 and will be used to assist in providing a safe truck access into the Rubbermaid Plant. The advisory panel met on June 22, 2015 and recommended the revised project move forward. The revised project received the Governor's approval on January 4, 2016. An amendment to the grant agreement is pending.

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On December 30, 2015, the Route 28 Highway Transportation Improvement District Commission submitted an application for consideration for the Final Design for Northbound Widening. In accordance with section 33.2-1529.1 of the Code of Virginia, TPOF can no longer be used for PPTA projects. Therefore, the project no longer qualifies and the application was withdrawn.

Chapter 684 of the 2015 Acts of Assembly (Section 33.2-1529.1 of the Code of Virginia) amended TPOF and became effective July 1, 2015. Changes in eligibility now require the applicant to be agency or political subdivision of the Commonwealth. The updates also prescribe that funds are for the sole purpose of addressing transportation aspects of economic development opportunities. Design-Build Projects and PPTA projects are no longer criteria for eligibility. Due to the changes, the Guidelines and Criteria and the application were revised by the Department in consultation with the Offices of the Secretary of Transportation and Commerce and Trade. The Commonwealth Transportation Board adopted the revised documentation on February 17, 2016.

The County of Chesterfield submitted an application on March 4, 2016 totaling \$5,000,000 to assist with improvements to the I-95/ Willis Road Interchange in support of the Shandong Tranlin Paper Company's facility being located in the James River Industrial Park. Tranlin expects to invest \$2 billion into the development of the facility and employ 2,000 people by 2020. The grant request was approved by the Advisory Panel on May 23, 2016 and is pending the Governor's approval.

As of June 30, 2016, thirty-six applications, representing twenty-seven separate projects, have been submitted requesting a total of \$195,728,000 in TPOF assistance. The Governor has approved awards totaling \$103,754,443. There is one award totaling \$5,000,000 and two reductions/rescissions totaling \$11,937,719 pending the Governor's approval. With this adjustment, projects that have reached financial close total \$91,816,714 (See attachment, Financial Close Total on page 2 and Total Awards on page 4).

The Fund is one of many tools available to market the Commonwealth to prospective economic development partners. Please let me know if I can provide additional information regarding these projects or the use of the Fund.

Chapter 847 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007 and Chapter 780 of the Acts of Assembly of 2016 Item 449.10 and Item 453 G - \$305,000,000 Appropriation

Through Item 449.10 of Chapter 847 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007, \$305,000,000 was allotted to TPOF out of the \$500,000,000 for the 2007 Transportation Initiative (the "Initiative") projects.

In 2008, the General Assembly, through Item 462 of Chapter 879 of the Acts of Assembly of 2008, reappropriated \$180,000,000 of the \$500,000,000 back to the Commonwealth of Virginia's General Fund. To substitute for these monies, Item 459.H. of Chapter 879 of the Acts of Assembly of 2008 authorized the issuance of \$180,000,000 of Capital Projects Revenue bonds.

Item 453 G. of Chapter 780 of the 2016 Acts of Assembly dedicated the \$31,070,647 that was remaining from the previous allocation to Road Improvements at military installations and improvements at interestate rest areas throughout the Commonwealth.
