# REPORT ON THE ACTUAL EXPENDITURES AND PERFORMANCE RESULTS ACHIEVED BY THE SOUTHERN VIRGINIA INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN TASK FORCE DURING THE 2016-2017 YEAR

#### **OVERVIEW OF THE TASK FORCE**

The Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, otherwise known as SOVA-ICAC, was founded in 1998 with funding from Department of Justice through the Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention. Originally the task force name was Operation Blue Ridge Thunder. The task force designation is through the Bedford County Sheriff's Office. Initial investigative responsibilities were investigating child sexual exploitation crimes perpetrated against children through the use of the Internet but was later changed to include most all child sexual exploitation crimes perpetrated against children to include, but not limited to, child trafficking and child prostitution.

The SOVA-ICAC is comprised of 145 affiliate agencies from all areas of Law Enforcement, the private sector and Non-Government Organizations. Law Enforcement support comes from Federal, State, County City/Local, Tribal and Military agencies. An (\*) denotes an agency that joined the Task Force this past year. Two new agencies signed MOU's, with several others renewed by new chiefs or sheriffs.

#### **PERSONNEL**

Funding in the Personnel category was allocated to pay salaries and benefits of core SOVA-ICAC personnel. Core SOVA-ICAC personnel operate out of the SOVA-ICAC office in Forest, Virginia, located within the confines of Bedford County, Virginia. ICAC personnel are employed by the Bedford County Sheriff's Office, or affiliates who have assigned investigators to work full-time out of the SOVA-ICAC main office. The staff is comprised of a Task Force Commander, Analyst, Cyber Tip Manager and Investigators. The investigative team is composed of two units, criminal investigations and forensic examiners. In the investigations unit, there are currently two sergeants, and five investigators, one being a K9 handler. In the forensic examiner unit, there is currently one sergeant, and two forensic investigators. In the time frame covered by this report, the SOVA-ICAC main office filled three criminal investigator positions. In addition, a new position was created within the unit of Financial Analyst. This position will be

responsible for all duties related to both federal and state funding management, accounting, inventory, etc. Current vacant positions during this report time period total three, and include the Financial Analyst, Forensic Examiner, and Criminal Investigator positions. It is anticipated that the Criminal Investigator position will be filled in the beginning of the FY17-18 period, by an affiliate agency assigning an investigator to the SOVA-ICAC main office. We are also actively looking for qualified candidates to fill the other two positions.

Over the past 12 months the SOVA-ICAC has been working in close cooperation with DCJS to distribute funding to affiliate agencies. A plan to distribute funding through the seven districts in three categories - personnel, equipment and travel and training was implemented, but proved challenging, as there were additional unspent funds that also had to be spent down. We are continuing to work with District Coordinators and affiliates to utilize the funding

## A few cases of interest during this reporting period include the following:



Tomas

**Bedford County, VA** - Paulo Tomas, 45 years old, of Cumberland, Rhode Island, was charged in December 2016 by Bedford County Sheriff's Office Investigators assigned to the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. Tomas was posing as an underage boy on various social media apps such as KIK and Musical.ly. He would then solicit other children to send sexually explicit photos of themselves to him, and he would also send them sexually explicit images.

Tomas was found to be living in Rhode Island, and with the assistance of the Rhode Island State Police/ICAC Task Force, a search warrant was executed at Tomas' residence. Based on additional evidence recovered as part of that search warrant, Tomas was subsequently indicted in

Virginia with charges including COV 18.2-374.1 (Production of Child Pornography), COV 18.2-374.3 (Use of Communications Device to Commit Offenses Against Children, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> or subsequent offenses). Tomas was also charged by Rhode Island authorities with possession of child pornography, for files found on his devices as a result of the executed search warrant.



Kerila

Gloucester County, VA – Jeffrey Kerila, 24 years old, of Pennsylvania, was arrested by the Gloucester County Sheriff's Office on charges related to violations of COV 18.2-374.1 (Production of Child Pornography). Investigators began looking at Kerila as a result of a Cyber tip received from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). Kerila used the social media app "Scout", to contact minors to solicit sexually explicit images. Two victims from Gloucester County were under the age of 10 years old, when Kerila contacted them.

Kerila pled guilty, and received a 20-year prison sentence, with 15 years suspended. He must also register as a sex offender.



Powell

*Martinsville, VA* – Justin Powell, 27 years old, of Bassett, VA, was arrested in April 2017, for a violation of COV 18.2-374.3 (Use of Communications Device to Commit Offenses Against Children). Powell communicated with and sent sexually explicit images of himself to what he believed to be a minor female, but was in fact an undercover officer participating in an undercover online sting.

Powell worked as a Deputy Sheriff for the Henry County Sheriff's Office, assigned to the jail as a Corrections Deputy. His trial is pending.



Nasser

**Louisa County, VA** - Amanda Nasser, 31 years old, was arrested in September 2016, and subsequently pled guilty to 18 charges, including four counts of violating COV 18.2-370 (Indecent Liberties) and seven counts of COV 18.2-374.3 (Use of a Communications Device to Commit Offenses Against Children).

Nasser was a sign language interpreter for a minor student at Louisa High School, and admitted to engaging in sexual intercourse with the victim at least four times, engaging in sexually explicit online chats with the victim, and sending nude photos of herself to the victim. Her sentencing hearing is scheduled for October 2017, where she faces a minimum mandatory seven years, to a maximum of 230 years in prison.



Reid

**Lynchburg, VA** - Justin Reid II, 56 years old, was arrested on 10 counts of COV 18.2-374.1:1 (Distribution of Child Pornography). The investigation began when Lynchburg Police Department, a member of the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, was contacted by authorities in Oklahoma with the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics, who, during a separate investigation had identified a subject in the Lynchburg area as participating in several online child pornography groups, and who was distributing child pornography.

Once Reid was identified as the subject, Lynchburg Police Department, with the assistance of Campbell County Sheriff's Office, also an affiliate agency on the Southern Virginia Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, simultaneously executed duel search warrants at Reid's place of employment in Lynchburg City, and at his residence in Campbell County. Reid was subsequently arrested on 10 counts of violating COV 18.2-374.1:1 (Distribution of Child Pornography).
