<sup>1</sup> Inpatient Acute Care Psychiatric Facilities frequently adjust staffed beds in the facility according to the census; some beds for 14-17 year olds can also be used for children under 14.

Numbers include Commonwealth Center for Children with 48 licensed and staffed beds.

<sup>2</sup> Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities frequently adjust staffed beds in the facility according to the census; some beds for 14-17 year olds can also be used for children under 14.

The number of inpatient acute care beds comes directly from the Bed Registry.

The number of psychiatric residential treatment beds has been extrapolated based on previous reports. A percentage was used to calculate the difference between the licensed beds and the staffed beds. Going forward, data will be collected directly from the facilities at a point in time to ensure the accuracy and quality of the data.
