RE: Report on Non-Supplanting Information Provided by Recipients of State Law Enforcement Assistance ("599" Funds)

Dear Delegate Jones and Senators Norment and Hanger:

Each year, DCJS distributes state funds to localities with qualifying police departments, as defined in §§9.1-165 through 9.1-172 of the *Code of Virginia*. These funds are intended to fund local public safety services. Pursuant to Item 400, paragraph C(2) of the Appropriations Act, recipients of these funds are required to certify that the funds will not be used to supplant any local funds provided for public safety services, and to report to DCJS the amounts of local funds provided for these services. The paragraph also directs DCJS to report this information to you.
