- SUBJECT: REVISED Quarterly Reports of Managed Care (Medicaid/CHIP) Encounter Data by Service Category for FY2018 Quarter 4 and FY2019 Quarters 1 -3

Attached are four revised reports pursuant to Item 307 B2 of the 2019 Appropriation Act, which states:

The Department of Medical Assistance Services shall submit a quarterly report summarizing managed care encounter data by service category in a format similar to the report in paragraph B.1. This quarterly report shall be submitted to the Department of Planning and Budget and the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees no later than 30 days after the end of each quarter.

Please discard the reports you received previously (they are posted as RD479, RD456, RD117, RD213) and replace with these.

DMAS is transitioning from the current information system to a new information system. As part of that transition, the summary encounter files are moving from an old platform to a data warehouse. Encounters are organized differently in the data warehouse than they are in the old platform. The original reports were created using an old encounter file platform while the new reports were created using the data warehouse. Going forward, DMAS will use the data warehouse to create these reports. The overall results do not vary but expenditures may shift from one period to another because the encounter files have different cut off periods than the data warehouse.
