During the first two quarters of fiscal year 2018, 5,125 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$ 2,957,668, and 4,882 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$ 2,721,017 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap.
