

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## Commonwealth of Virginia IT Projects Status Report for May 2019 - Report Description

The report, organized by project life cycle phase, summarizes information as of the latest IT Project Status Reports submitted through ProSight, unless otherwise noted. The information includes the most recent agency rating of the Dashboard Key Status Indicators, CIO assessment and comment, and comments from the Auditor of Public Accounts (APA).
