²The Restrictive Housing Program focuses on improved conditions of confinement, including individual and group programming services, increased recreational/out-of-cell opportunities and progression to unrestrained movement. This process requires increased reviews for offender placement and step-down progression through a collaborative multi-disciplinary team evaluation. Applying the program statewide is intended to prevent offenders from escalating to longer term, higher security restrictive housing. Locations include:

-Buckingham, Greensville CC, Pocahontas, St. Brides (April 2016)

-Expanded to all Male Field Units, Work Centers, Level 2 Facilities, and Level 3 Facilities (May 2018)

-Expanded to Keen Mountain and River North (August 2018)

-Expanded to Red Onion and Wallens Ridge excluding Security Level S (August 2018)

-Expanded to Sussex I & II in November 2018

³The Level S Step Down Program consists of two separate pathways for offenders to progress out of restrictive housing to a general population setting: The Special Management (SM) Pathway is for offenders who have frequently recurring disciplinary violations; who have a history of fighting with other offenders or violent resistance towards intervention resulting in assault or attempted assault towards staff, but without the intent to invoke serious harm or the intent to kill; or who intentionally commit disciplinary violations with the goal of remaining in Restrictive Housing. The Intensive Management (IM) Pathway is for offenders who have a history that indicates the willingness to carry out intentional serious or deadly harm; who are a high escape risk; or who have committed high profile crimes and/or significant media attention and may be targets of other offenders.

⁴Diagnosis of Serious Mental Illness includes MH-2S-Serious Mental Illness, MH-3-Moderate Mental Impairment, and MH-4-Severe Mental Impairment.
