Dear Chairmen Norment, Hanger, Jones, Obenshain, and Bell:

Virginia Code § 16.1-69.10 provides that the Committee on District Courts shall make a study and report to the General Assembly on the number of district court judges needed and the districts for which they shall be authorized. In 2018, the Committee on District Courts recommended the authorization of one new general district judgeship in the 19th Judicial District of Virginia, which remains unauthorized. The financial impact for the creation of a new district court judgeship will be \$ 261,303. An analysis of district judgeship costs is enclosed.

As you are aware, in December 2017, the Executive Committee of the Committee on District Courts adopted the NCSC's report and recommendations contained in the 2017 Virginia Judicial Workload Assessment Report. Based on the recommendations in the Report, the number of judicial positions in the districts authorized in in Va. Code § 16.1-69.6:1 were amended and became effective July 1, 2018. The assessments and recommendations made in the Report remain pertinent.
