## Renewal Purpose of Grant

In addition to emergency shelter, our direct services include but are not limited to court accompaniment sssistance in obtaining protective services, legal advocacy, access to a legal clinic and other areas of the criminal justice system; Throughout our 6 rural communities the shelter also provides mobile advocacy to various places to meet their physical, medical, financial, mental, housing and job seeking needs. Through our weekly support groups, one on one licensed counseling and intensive case management we afford them short- and long-term counseling for crisis, safety planning and other areas to psychological needs. We offer transitional program food, clothing, transportation, childcare assistance, after-school tutoring and the

Collins Center provides comprehensive information, direct services including advocacy, accompaniment, and therapy, forensic interviewing when appropriate, and outreach to victims of sexual assault and their non-offending caregivers. Collins Center During the first to quarters of PT18, Collins Center served 272 adults and children needing direct services following sexual violence utilizing SAGP funds and expects to make services the contract of the co

The Family Violence/Sexual Assault Unit provides direct services and comprehensive information to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, including oversight and operation of the Emporia Child Advocacy Center (CAC) formerly funded through a DCIS new initiative grant. It is estimated that between 7/1/19 and 6/30/20, 700 victims will receive direct services through this program. From 7/1/18 through 12/31/18 the program provided direct services to 342 victims. For FY 18 (7/1/17 to 6/30/18)

Project Horizon provides comprehensive information and direct services to sexual assault and domestic violence victims. It is estimated that during July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 (FY 2020), 400 victims of domestic violence and 100 victims of sexual assault will receive direct services through this program. Services will include a 24-hour crisis hotine, emergency shelter, individual and group cashines described by the program. Services will include a 24-hour crisis hotine, emergency shelter, individual and group cashines and services for underserved within populations, and victim and systems advocacy.

James House provides comprehensive information and direct services to sexual assault and domestic violence victims it is estimated that during July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 [P7 2021], 875 victims of domestic violence and 875 victims of sexual assault will receive direct services through this program. During the period Jul 1, 2019 and Jun 20, 2020, 1150 hotline calls were answered and 457 victims received face to face services.

This project will provide victim-centered, trauma informed victim advocacy services to 200 victims of crime that are identified through investigations and prosecutions conducted by Assistant Attorney's General (AAG). The advocates will coordinate with or directly provide, services to victims and witnesses in OAG-lead cases in collaboration and coorperation with local victim assistance programs. The OAG will evaluate services provided, identity gaps and adjust service provision as necessary. The program

With VSGP funds RCASA will serve at least 1433 victims of sexual violence through direct service (such as counseling, art therapy, psychoeducational groups, hotline response, hospital and court accompaniment, etc.).

Haven of the Dan River Region, Inc., serves primary and secondary victims of domestic violence &/or sexual assault, throughout the City of Danville and Pittsylvania County. Increase funding will enable the establishment of a crisis/emergency response team (CERT) to be created simultaneously with the development of Centra Health's establishment of a forensic program in Pittsylvania County, Gretna VA. In addition to 24/7 CERT response, Increase funding will enable us to hire, train & equip staff in order that our outreach and direct services can be directed to the outer corners of our county, to our most vulnerable. We conservatively anticipate doubling our direct services in our first year and increasing by one-third the second funding year. In addition, an increase in funding will permit a licensed counselor to provide immediate and ongoing direct services to all clients, provide cultural, alternative healing practices to include trauma informed yoga, meditative practices, sound and art therapy, as well as a youth theatre peer-to-peer troupe, services that create bridges to healing, and relationship of trust of self and others.

Bedford Domestic Violence Services provides comprehensive information and direct services to domestic violence victims. It is estimated that during July 1, 2017 and June 30, 2018 (FY 2018), 100 victims of domestic violence will receive direct services through this program.

The Donyars' Domestic and Sexual Violence program provides direct services to sexual assault and domestic violence victims via a 24/7 hotline shelter & supportive services court advocacy services hospital accompaniment housing support and therapeutic counseling and groups. It is estimated that during July 1, 2019 and June 30, 2020 (FY 2020), 2,085 victims of domestic violence, 605 victims of sexual assault, and 330 children who are victims of or exposed to domestic or sexual viol receive direct services through this program.

The Eastern Shore Coalition Against Domestic Violence (ESCADV) provides free, confidential support, shelter, safety, and empowerment to domestic violence (DV) and sexual assault (SA) victims, and educates the community about how to prevent DV/SA.

individual and group counseling, emergency financial assistance and transportation for survivors. The program anticipates providing services to 2,000 survivors during PT 2020.

FCDVSAAP will use extensive supportive services developed by the program, essential community partnerships, and fundamental outreach efforts to reach our primary goals and objectives. Advocates will provide supportive services to empower victims of sexual assault and domestic violence. Emotional support, advocate counseling, advocacy for victim rights, guidance through the criminal justice process, victim accompaniment, DV/SA support groups to provide victims a core network of support, and provide service/safety plans to re-establish a sense of personal safety and security to the victims. Advocates will distribute program information, brochures, handouts and other various resources to the community. The

estimated number of victims to receive direct services due to these funds for FY20 is 300.

HER is an active and collaborative partner in creating a community response for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and human trafficking and seeks to continue providing direct services through information and referral personal advocacy. motional support and safety services, providing emergency shelter and relocation assistance for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. These services are provided through the continuation of implementing community wide collaborations and best practices such as the Lethality Assessment Program, Domestic Violence Task Forces, SART and the Regional Coordinated Hotline for Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Human Trafficking.

Abuse Alternatives Inc. is requesting fund to enhance the current demostic violence intervention services and outreach services offered to direct service victims of demostic violence. The increase funding will provide more comprehensive services to direct service vitims. It is estimated that a total of 1400 direct service victims will be provided services in FY 19-20 with VSGP funds through 24 hour crisis hotline, emergency shelter, advocacy and/or outreach, children's services and support groups. Hope House of Scott County proposes to provide emergency shelter and comprehensive services to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence. These services shall include information and referral, personal advocacy and accompaniment, emotional support and safety services, shelter services, and criminal and civil justice assistance, as well as community outreach to better inform our locality of the services we provide. Between 7/1/18 and 12/31/18, 54 direct service victims were served. We anticipate providing direct services to 130 victims of sexual assault and domestic violence during FY19.
